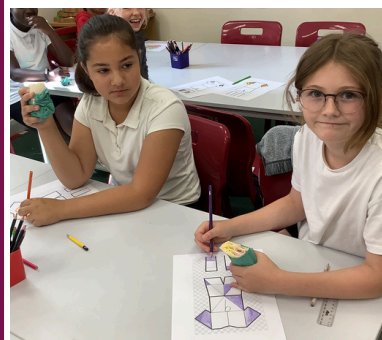
Attendance Matters

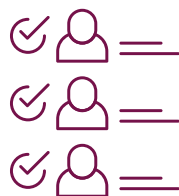
7:30am - Breakfast Club (application only)
