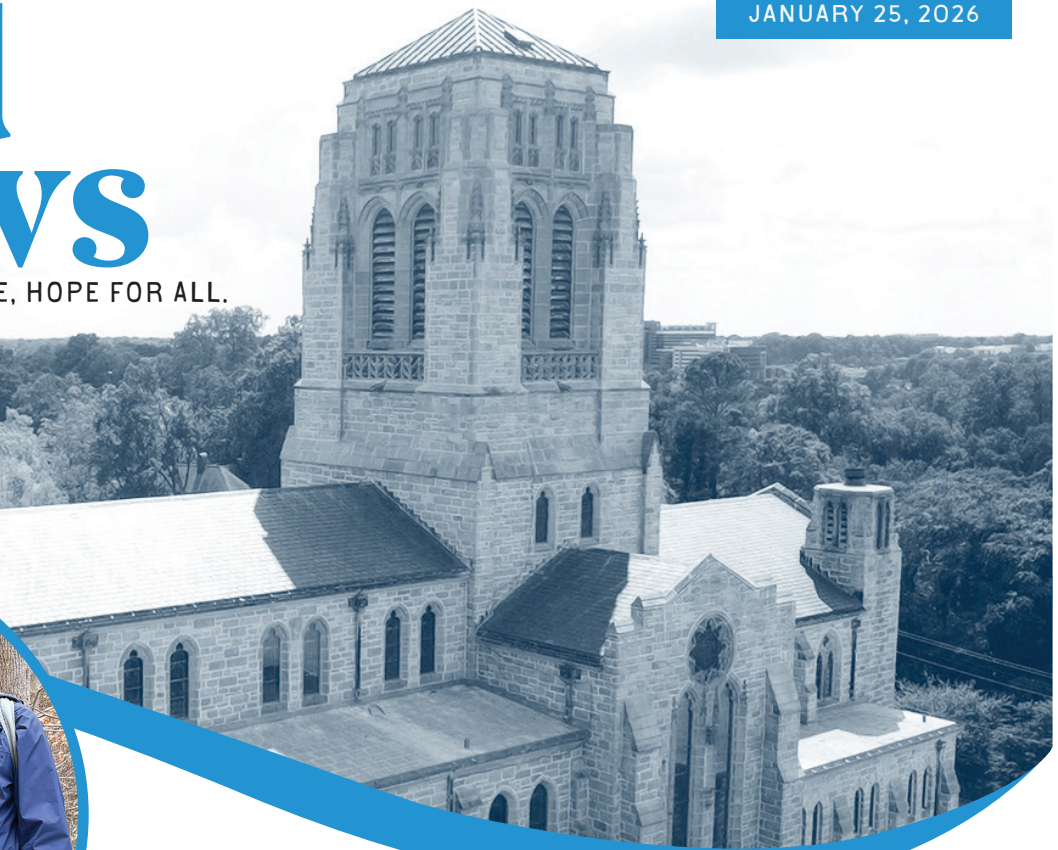

Walking with God: *The Labyrinth as Spiritual Practice*

Sunday, February 1 | 2:30-4:30pm | The Chapel

Early Christians, filled with joy by their new faith, longed to make a pilgrimage to express their trust, gratitude, and prayers. To meet the needs of those unable to travel, churches started to engrave labyrinths on their walls and floors so that all could become pilgrims. The first recorded labyrinth was in the Basilica of St. Reparatus in Algeria in 325 AD, and the most famous one was completed in Chartres in 1201 AD. Now there are almost 6,000 registered labyrinths in 85 countries worldwide, and many more that are unregistered. This seminar on walking the labyrinth will include an introduction to the labyrinth and its history; why we walk the labyrinth for our bodies, minds, and spirit; quiet reflection time; and group sharing.
