EASTER Offering

As we approach the Easter Day services, St. Paul's would like to continue the tradition of asking the parish to consider providing a heartfelt gift to programs served through the Outreach Ministry. This year, gifts will go directly to the St. Paul's Crisis Fund. This longstanding financial support fund helps people in the community who are experiencing financial crisis due to loss of income, health related crisis, or family crisis.

Did you know that the crisis fund has been around for more than 50 years? During that time, the crisis fund has morphed from a rector's discretionary fund into a program operated by Outreach Ministry. As our community has grown and diversified, so has the accountability of the crisis fund. This fund is budgeted and managed by the Outreach Director and is responsibly utilized to help give people a chance to get back on their feet. Recently, with the increased utility rates across the county, the crisis fund has provided more than 20 families utility bill relief to prevent termination of service and overwhelming payoff amounts.
