As we approach the Easter Day services, St. Paul's would like to continue the tradition of asking the parish to consider providing a heartfelt gift to programs served through the Outreach Ministry. This year, gifts will go directly to the St. Paul's Crisis Fund. This longstanding financial support fund helps people in the community who are experiencing financial crisis due to loss of income, health-related crisis, or family crisis.

Did you know that we can receive over 20 calls a week for crisis funding? Often, the first step for people seeking crisis support in the community is a call to St Paul's front desk. Each staff member and volunteer who answers the phone provides a kind and nurturing response to those in need. People calling who do not have a referral are provided with a list of community resources and phone numbers for them to call. The emotional integrity and the kindness that is provided by the St. Paul's staff and volunteers to individuals on the other end of the phone is one of the greatest impacts that is provided in the initial stages. We often hear such gratitude for the listening ear, the time given and the validation people hear when they call.
