#### **Careers Provider Access Statement**

#### Introduction

This policy statement sets out the academy's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the academy for the purposes of giving them information about the provider's education or training courses/opportunities. This complies with the academy's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997. and the Baker Clause as an amendment to the Technical and Further Education Act 2017. Direction is taken from the Access for education and training providers Statutory guidance for schools 2022.

#### Student entitlement

Students in years 8-13 are entitled:

- to find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of our Careers programme, which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- to hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options evenings, careers fairs, assemblies and group discussions, visits and taster events.
- to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.
