Applications



What's New?

The new system simplifies the process for staff and makes recognition more meaningful for students. Instead of the previous pledge-based approach, awards will now be **centrally managed**, ensuring fairness and consistency across the school.

How It Works

- **Tiered Awards:** Students can achieve Bronze, Silver, Gold, and Koinonia levels, recognising effort and commitment throughout the year.
- **Student Ownership:** Students take responsibility for meeting targets, with guidance provided during assemblies, themed weeks, and form time.
- **Positive Behaviour Focus:** We are making more use of ClassCharts to track achievements and award positives centrally, reducing teacher workload.

Exciting New Initiatives

- **Golden Tickets:** Every staff member can award three tickets weekly to students who go above and beyond.
- **Classroom Champion:** One student per lesson will be recognised for exceptional effort.
- **Zero Hero:** Students with 100% attendance will be celebrated in assemblies and on dedicated displays.


For Older Year Groups

Strengthening Our Partnership with Leeds United Foundation

Last term, Abbey Grange welcomed the Leeds United Foundation Positive Choices team, who worked with our entire Year 10 cohort across two dedicated days. This impactful programme, delivered in collaboration with West Yorkshire Police, focused on empowering students to make informed decisions about their futures.

Throughout the day, students engaged in a series of workshops led by guest speakers sharing real-life experiences on challenging topics such as gang affiliation, knife crime, grooming, substance misuse, and unhealthy relationships. These sessions provided a safe space for open discussion, helping students understand the consequences of choices and the importance of resilience and responsibility.

A highlight of the event was the visit from Lucas Radebe, former Leeds United and South Africa captain and current Foundation Ambassador. His presence inspired students and reinforced the message of leadership and positive decision-making. He even stayed after school to get involved with the girls' football training. What a legend!

Parents' FAQs: Work Experience for Year 10 & Year 12

1. Why is work experience important?

Work experience helps students:

- Gain insight into the world of work.
- Develop transferable skills such as communication, teamwork, and problem-solving.
- Explore career interests and make informed decisions about future pathways.
- Strengthen applications for college, university, apprenticeships, and jobs.

2. When does work experience take place?

- **Year 10:** Monday 6th - Friday 10th July 2026
- **Year 12:** Monday 27th April - Friday 1st May 2026.

3. How do students find a placement?

- Students are encouraged to approach local businesses, family contacts, or community organisations.
- School can support with placements if you are struggling to find somewhere suitable. Please email Mrs Landau at elandau@abbeygrangeacademy.co.uk

4. What types of placements are suitable?

- Any role that provides insight into a workplace environment.
- It doesn't have to match a student's future career choice—skills gained are transferable.



5. Who is responsible for health and safety checks?

- The school will ensure the employer meets safeguarding and insurance requirements using the placement tool on Unifrog. Employers are required to upload all the relevant documents to ensure their workplace is appropriate and meets the legal requirements.
- Parents should also confirm the placement appropriate for their child on Unifrog, once the employer has filled in their part.

6. Does the placement need to be paid?

- No, work experience is unpaid. The focus is on learning, not earning.

7. How do students record their placement on Unifrog?

Students should:

- Log in to Unifrog.
- Navigate to the Placements Tool.
- Enter details such as employer name, email address, dates, etc.
- Upload any required documents (e.g., consent forms).

8. What if my child cannot find a placement?

- Speak to the school's careers team for support.
- If a placement still cannot be found, your child will attend school as normal but will follow a careers focused timetable and have the chance to meet different employers across different sectors.
