At Lightcliffe C of E Primary School, we are committed to embedding long-term, sustainable improvements in physical education and school sport through strategic use of the PE and Sport Premium. Our approach focuses on three key strategies:

#### 1. Active Lunchtimes:

We have previously invested in high-quality play equipment which is now embedded into our daily timetable, specifically during lunchtimes. We have now included sports activities led by external sports coaches to facilitate sporting activities which is inclusive for all. By supporting these activities, we are ensuring that active play becomes part of our school culture. This approach helps pupils build positive habits around physical activity that will continue beyond the life of the funding.

### 2. Raising the Profile of PE and Sport:

We are committed to delivering high-quality PE lessons and encouraging participation in a broad range of sports and physical activities. By fostering a whole-school ethos that values movement and physical health, we aim to instil a lifelong enjoyment of being active both indoors and outdoors. Staff training funded by the premium will continue to impact teaching and learning into the future.



#### 3. Inclusive Extra-Curricular Activities:

We have always been able to provide a range of after-school activities led by the PE leader, but investment from the fund has enabled us to develop a range of multi-activities inclusive to all pupils. Where we have private companies delivering skateboarding, we have been able to support disadvantaged pupils and support pupils with SEND to enable attendance.

Through these strategies, we are creating an environment that supports long-term positive attitudes toward physical activity, ensuring that the improvements funded by the PE and Sport Premium remain impactful and sustainable well into the future.
