During collective worship and class reflection time will be thinking about how we show that we care, we share, we laugh, and we learn together.

RE

We will be exploring Incarnation and considering the question:
Why does Christmas matter to Christians?

Maths

We'll be covering place value, addition and subtraction. This will involve understanding teen numbers, ordering and comparing numbers. We will also use number lines to support with addition and subtraction.

Humanities

In History we will be asking the question:
How has flight changed?
Our particular focus will be on the famous Amy Johnson, who bravely flew solo to Australia. We will look at how people reacted to her achievements and her legacy.

PSHE

Our topic will be continued on from last half term, which will be "All about me". Our focus will be on feelings and emotional literacy and keeping healthy and clean. Tom from Leeds United will be in to deliver additional PSHE lessons.



PE Sessions

Science

Our key enquiry question is: What are the seasons?
We will be exploring how seasons are characterised by different weather conditions, changes in daylight hours and variations in animal and plant behaviour.

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Wider Curriculum

Art – we will be looking at "Flora and Fauna". We will practise sketches of plants and mini beasts, finally leading to our collages of the natural living world.

Music – we will be exploring sound using voices and instruments.

Computing – Digital writing. We'll be developing keyboard skills to type text and learning how to format it, before comparing to writing non-digitally.



Building physical skills

In our daily lessons, we will be following Squiggle While You Wiggle to develop our gross motor skills. We will also have daily dough disco and handwriting lessons for our fine motor skills.



What will we be reading?

In class, we will be enjoying reading a range of traditional tales and Roald Dahl stories.

Phonics

Daily phonics sessions using our Little Wandle. Your child will bring home books regularly which support them to learn the sounds they have covered in class.
Remember to remind your child to use their segmenting fingers when decoding any unknown words.

English

We will be reading *Dogger* to support our writing and learning about persuasive writing and narrative retelling. We will also look at the traditional tale Jack and the Beanstalk to develop our narrative retelling further.
