

In Year 5, we have explored the artistic concept of negative space. We used other artists' landscape pieces and recreated our own versions. We then brought them home for our families to enjoy.




In Year 4, we have been making Ancient Egyptian mummies. The children have enjoyed designing their own mummies using hieroglyphics!






## Year 6 Automata Toy Project

In year 3 we have started our topic about forces. We explored the forces of pushing and pulling that we used when we play.




We have also explored friction caused by different surfaces when sliding an object down a slope.

In year 4 we have begun learning about states of matter. This week we were investigating the different melting points of some solids including jelly babies, chocolate and coconut oil.




We tried to predict which solid would melt first and last. We found the coconut oil melted first and the white chocolate last!

## What SEND Looks Like at St. Chad's

At St. Chad's, we are proud to be an inclusive school where every child is known, valued and supported to thrive. SEND stands for Special Educational Needs and Disabilities and simply means that some children need additional or different support to what would usually be provided for most pupils, to help them learn, communicate or regulate in school. Lots of children will need this kind of support at some point during their school journey, and this does not define their potential.

Our approach always starts with high-quality classroom teaching. Teachers carefully adapt lessons, routines and resources so learning is accessible to all. When children need extra support, we follow a clear, step-by-step process called the graduated approach (assess-plan-do-review) to ensure support is timely, appropriate and reviewed regularly. This helps us respond thoughtfully to children's needs.

SEND support at St. Chad's is not about labels. It is about understanding children as individuals – recognising their strengths, noticing where they may find things tricky, and adjusting our approach so they can succeed. Support may be short-term or longer-term and always evolves as children grow and develop.


### Try this at home:

# LaunchPad Sports Club

## **Mondays 3.15-4.15pm - KS1\* and KS2**

LaunchPad Multi Sports gives children the opportunity to explore twelve different sports across the school year. Each sport runs for three weeks so pupils can enjoy variety while building coordination and confidence. Sessions combine team games, individual challenges and competitions that reward participation and adaptability.
