# 80% Achieve A or A\*

**Our recent EPQ (The Extended Project Qualification) results are truly exceptional.**

Out of 20 entries, **30% achieved the highest grade of A\*** and an impressive **50% secured an A**. In addition, **15% earned a strong B grade**, while **5% achieved a commendable C**. These figures reflect the outstanding commitment, research skills and academic excellence demonstrated by our students throughout the EPQ process.

The EPQ is a **UK Level 3 qualification**, where students independently research a topic of their choice, **developing university-level skills in research, critical thinking, and project management**.

### Maths Department Shines in Annual Maths Challenge

The Maths Department proudly took part in this year's prestigious **Annual Maths Challenge, showcasing the problem-solving skills and logical thinking** that defines our students. Participants tackled a series of complex and creative questions designed to stretch mathematical understanding beyond the classroom.
