Academics

Frank L. Hain, Jr.

(Posthumously) Class of 1955





Frank was born in Oakland, California, in 1937. After the loss of his father in 1939, he and his mother moved to Oceanside, where Frank worked at the MiraMar Restaurant throughout high school to support them both. A standout student at OHS, he served as an officer in both the Latin Club and Bible Club, earned lifetime membership in CSF, and received the DAR History Award and Bank of America Math and Science Award. He also excelled in athletics, winning an Avocado League track final, and graduated as valedictorian. His peers recognized his promise, voting him "Most Likely to Succeed." In 1959, Frank graduated cum laude from Occidental College with a B.S. in Physics. He went on to

pursue graduate studies in physics and electrical engineering at Columbia University, where he also served as the head teaching assistant in the Physics Department. From 1961 to 1972, Frank worked for Hughes Aircraft Company and NASA. As a design engineer, he developed the power control system for the Surveyor lunar soft-landing spacecraft. He also played a critical role in the Apollo program, managing the computer, video, and telemetry ground support systems. He was stationed at Honeysuckle Creek in Australia when the world watched Neil Armstrong take his first steps on the moon, footage relayed through the very systems Frank helped oversee. Later, Frank joined RCA Global Communications, where he served as hardware manager under a contract with the Shah of Iran. In the 1970s, he oversaw the implementation of computer-controlled switching systems across Iran's major cities. In the 1980s, Frank served as the Vice President of Network Communications at Credit Suisse in Manhattan. Until his retirement in 2001, he was responsible for the design, implementation, and daily operations of the firm's computer networks housed in the World Trade Center. On September 11, 2001, Frank survived the terrorist attacks on the towers. A brilliant engineer and resilient individual, Frank's career spanned pioneering achievements in aerospace, global communications, and financial infrastructure, all while bearing witness to—and surviving—some of the most significant moments in modern history.

Paul Counts

Class of 1976






Born and raised in Oceanside, California, Paul Counts attended Laurel and Libby Elementary Schools, Lincoln Junior High, and graduated from Oceanside High School in 1976. He began his college studies at MiraCosta College in 1977 before transferring to Palomar College in 1978, earning his Associate of Arts degree in 1980. It was at Palomar that Paul first discovered his passion for glassblowing while studying art. He continued his education at California State University, Fullerton, receiving his B.A. in Art in 1983 and his M.A. in Art in 1985. From 1985 to 1992, Paul served as

an adjunct professor of glassblowing at Orange Coast College. During this time, he also founded Paul Counts Art Glass Studio and began showcasing his work at national wholesale and retail events. His pieces soon gained recognition and were featured in galleries across the country. From 1995 to 2000, he returned to Palomar College as an adjunct professor, continuing to share his expertise. As a full-time studio artist and instructor, Paul has taught in various institutions throughout the U.S. and has traveled internationally to attend and participate in Glass Art Society conferences. Throughout his self-employed career, Paul has cherished the creative process above all else. While he values the finished work, it is the act of creation that truly defines his journey. Grateful for a life devoted to art, he offers his work as a token of appreciation for the privilege of living as an artist. He could not have dreamed of a better path.

Athletics

Dave Barrett

Class of 1970





Born in Omaha, Nebraska to Master Gunnery Sergeant Howard Barrett and Betty Barrett. The family, with sister Diane, settled in Oceanside in 1966 after his father's final tour in Vietnam, and Dave began his lifelong connection with Oceanside High School. The rich athletic heritage of OHS captured and enthralled him. He played football and baseball for Hall of Fame coach, Herb Meyer. While at OHS, he also made a commitment to follow Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior, and helped establish the first Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) huddle in San Diego County at OHS. After graduating from OHS, he played

football and baseball at MiraCosta and California Lutheran University and graduated Summa Cum Laude with BA degrees in English and Philosophy and a minor in PE. He obtained a teaching credential from Pt. Loma and was hired as an English teacher at OHS in 1978. Coaches and coaching, as well as his faith, had a profound impact on his life, so he was drawn into coaching. In 1976 Coach Chuck Hall hired him as a volunteer football coach. He continued to coach football at OHS until 2005. Named Head Baseball Coach in 1978, he continued until 2024. His teams won seven league championships and reached three CIF finals. Among the accolades he has received are: SD County All-Stars coach (four times), So. California All-Star coach (three times), induction to the California Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame (2004), NCTimes Coach of the Year (2007), FCA "Coaches Heart" Award (2010), CIF Model Coach in 2018, SD Padres Coach of the Year nominee (2023), and San Diego High School Coaching Legends Hall of Fame (2025). In 1979 he married OHS graduate (1976) Patty Raue, and they have three sons: OHS grads Jason (1999), Steve (1999), and James Patrick. They are now the proud grandparents of seven: Anna, Manna (2025 OHS grad), Cana, Matthew, Noah, Julia, and Jaina.

Business

Theresa Renee Morrison

Class of 1978





Theresa Renee Morrison, born and raised in Oceanside, California, comes from a Texas family with deep-rooted history—her parents migrated from Texas when her father was stationed at Camp Pendleton, seeking refuge from the Jim Crow South. A dedicated student, she attended Ditmar and Garrison Elementary, Jefferson Jr. High, and OHS, later earning a Business Administration degree with an emphasis in Professional Accounting from Long Beach State University. She was a member of the OHS award-winning Pirateer and the O.Y.A.C, served as a lead delegate to the California Scholarship Federation, and a

leading role on the debate team for the San Diego All-American Model United Nations. As an active member of the ASB Council, she also served as Treasurer, assisting the boosters, sports teams, clubs and organizations with her God-gifted financial talents. Renee grew up as a member of the Second Missionary Baptist Church. Her father, a decorated war veteran, received the Bronze Star from President Richard Nixon in 1969. and her godmother, Sister Charlesetta Reece Allen, was a pioneering civil rights leader honored with an Oceanside post office dedication in 2024 by President Joe Biden. She was a devout minister, founder of the Oceanside Girls Club, and the first President of the North County NAACP. Their influence shaped Theresa's dedication to social justice, business, and faith. With over 45 years of financial expertise, Theresa became a soughtafter CFO specializing in nonprofit finance, holding C-Suite/CFO roles—including as the first Black finance leader at the Recording Academy (the GRAMMYs) and the Library Foundation of Los Angeles. As a single parent, she raised two accomplished children—Julian, is a dual bachelor-degreed and coveted Texas-based computer engineer, and Mariyah, an exceptionally gifted licensed therapist with a Master's in Psychology. Renee's life is a testament to resilience, leadership, and unwavering commitment to service.

Charles "Rusty" Russell

Class of 1980





I was born and raised in Oceanside, California, where I attended Mission and Garrison Elementary Schools, Jefferson Junior High, and graduated from Oceanside High School in 1980. While growing up, I worked alongside my father at the Bauer Lumber Company, where I learned the importance of hard work and dedication—values that have guided me throughout my life. In 1985, I co-founded S & R Towing with my friend Steve Dugan.

What began as a small operation with a single truck has grown over the past 40 years into a company with over 50 trucks and 9 locations, proudly serving communities throughout the region. In 1989, I married Lisa D'Andrea (also an OHS graduate), and together we raised three sons—Jeremy, Travis, and Cody. All three achieved the rank of Eagle Scout, and today, two of them work alongside me at S & R Towing, continuing our family legacy. Giving back to the community has always been a priority for me. Over the years, I have donated trucks for Oceanside's 4th of July parades, supported local high school auto shop programs at Oceanside and El Camino, and dedicated time to coaching Little League. While involved with Little League, I helped install electronic scoreboards and played a key role in the remodeling of the snack bar. I have also remained active in Scouting, supporting the next generation of leaders. I am proud of the business we have built, the family we have raised, and the city we continue to serve.

Public Service

Kenneth Hempfleng

Class of 1976





Kenny Hempfleng's journey began in Oceanside, California, where he moved in 1970 after his father was stationed at Camp Pendleton. He quickly found his stride—literally—running track and cross country at Oceanside High School, graduating in 1976. After high school, Kenny stayed in California for a time, working for the Deutsch Electronic Division before returning to his Alabama roots. Over the next several years, he took on demanding, hands-on jobs—working tugboats along

the Mississippi River, commercial shrimp boats in the Gulf, and supply boats servicing the offshore oil fields. In 1985, Kenny answered a higher calling and joined the Prichard Police Department. After graduating from the Southwest Alabama Police Academy, he began his law enforcement career in the Patrol Division. In January 1988, his bravery was tested when he was shot five times in the line of duty. For his courage and sacrifice, he received the Legion of Honor, Wounded in Combat Award, and the Blue and Gold Wounded in Service Award. Later that year, Kenny joined the Daphne Police Department, where he rose through the ranks from Patrol Officer to Sergeant, then Lieutenant. As lead instructor, he mentored many and continued serving in Patrol. Committed to growth, Kenny completed the CLEEP Program and attended the prestigious FBI National Academy (Session 263), earning certification as an Alabama Chief of Police. From 2019 to 2023, he served as Chief of Police for the Town of Silverhill. Kenny's life reflects a legacy of strength, sacrifice, and dedicated service to others.
