




American Stage Education promotes intellectual, social, and emotional growth through inclusive and accessible programs, including productions for young audiences and enriching collaborations with schools and community groups.

## Summer Camp

## SchoolTour


For over a generation, many children from the Tampa Bay area have experienced theatre for the first time through the American Stage School Tour. Each year, professional theatre artists visit elementary schools to perform culturally relevant stories and provide teachers with a study guide aligned with Florida State Standards. For Pinellas County schools, the program is fully funded by the district and free to participate.

Reaches about 10000 K-5 students annually








Write On! Pinellas Playwriting Residencies offer educational modules in collaborative storytelling at no cost to Pinellas County secondary schools. Over the course of an academic semester, students develop their own plays, gaining confidence as they explore their creative voices, collaborate with peers, and cultivate empathy and self-awareness.

Write On! *Si Se Puede* provides no-cost educational modules in collaborative storytelling for Pinellas County ESOL classrooms. Over the course of a semester, students create their own plays through kinesthetic learning and engagement with our culturally responsive school tour. American Stage partners with local educators and the Pinellas County School District to provide students with access to high-quality, professional live theatre. Each year, at least two Mainstage productions are selected to align with educators' curricula, offering a performance, a post-show talkback, and an in-class workshop led by an American Stage teaching artist.

## OUR SPONSOR A STUDENT PROGRAM

Our Sponsor-A-Student program provides scholarships for children and teens to attend drama school classes, Summer Camp, or outreach programs at little or no cost. Many of the students we support come from families with limited financial means, live in foster care, or have special needs. Through collaborative theatre-making, students have fun while building confidence, enhancing communication skills, developing leadership abilities, and discovering more about themselves and others.

Around 60 scholarships are awarded each year!





### OUR TEACHING ARTISTS

Around 30 professional teaching artists are employed annually to facilitate our educational programs, receiving year-round professional development to enhance their artistry and classroom skills. From 2014 to 2019, American Stage was recognized three times by the WEDU Be More Awards—once for outreach programs like Write On! and School Tour, and twice for our teaching artists, whose contributions are essential to their success.



# OUR PROFESSIONAL APPRENTICE PROGRAM

Each year, American Stage employs about 3 apprentices who support our educational programs and gain knowledge in nonprofit regional theatre, focusing on arts education and teaching artistry. Apprentices also assist in operations such as front of house, box office, marketing, development, events, artistic, company management, finance, and community engagement.
