Adult Behavioral Health Services

Culturally-Specific Programs

Clinica Latina:

Clinica Latina provides mental health and substance use disorder services to Spanish speaking individuals by professional bilingual and bicultural clinicians.

Our Spanish speaking therapists recognize and respect the beliefs, perspectives, and values of our consumers from a particular race and ethnicity.

Ujima:

Ujima is a culturally specific program dedicated to promoting the quality of life and self-identity of individuals and/or families who identify as Black, indigenous, or persons of color.

The mission of Ujima is to provide services for mental health, trauma, and other contributing life stressors. Ujima provides a wide array of services to meet consumers' needs.

Family Preservation Program (FPP)

The Family Preservation Program (FPP) is a short-term, intensive, inhome service designed to keep families with children ages 0-12 years together safely, and reduce the need for out-of-home placements.

This is done by providing intensive, skill-based services to families who are working with Dane County Child Protective Services (DCCPS) and are at risk of their children being removed from the home.

Legal Diversion Services

Clinical Assessment Unit:

Providing assessments for those who have been charged or convicted of an Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) offense.

OWI Treatment Court:

Providing screenings, assessments, referrals, and treatment for those in the Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) Treatment Court jail diversion program.
