You have the right to

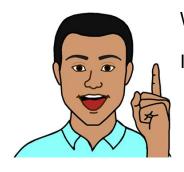
- meet friends

We have some ideas for you.

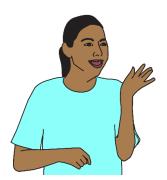
It may help you take part.

- things you know about. Like you are a parent.



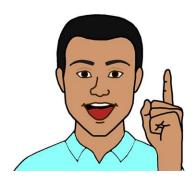
You can help make things better.

You may want to help other people.

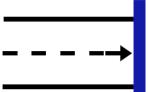
Like you work in a garden. You like the work.

You do **not** get paid. You are a volunteer.



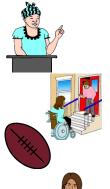
You may like to talk to people online.
