

2026 Electrolysis Program

Program Outline

The 2026 Electrolysis Program consists of 600 clock hours, designed to be completed over approximately 5 months or 19 weeks on a full-time basis. Students attend classes for 32 hours per week.

Course Description

This comprehensive program is divided into several areas of concentration. To be eligible for graduation, students must complete all 600 hours of theory and practical training, fulfill all assignments, meet model requirements, and pass all theory, practical, and exit exams. Written exams are administered, covering chapters listed on the course calendar. Theory classes utilize a variety of teaching methods, such as lectures, audio/visual aids, group demonstrations, guest speakers, and other techniques tailored to each student's learning style.

Program Description

The Electrolysis Program is designed for applicants seeking to become Licensed Electrologists and who can commit to attending onsite classes. This elite program offers daily education and hands-on demonstrations, making it ideal for students who benefit from extensive practical instruction. Each day includes one hour of theory instruction followed by clinical practice for the remainder of the day. Students receive extensive training and must book and service a total of 30 paying models before receiving a Certificate of Completion. If a student has not completed the model requirement by their scheduled graduation date, a \$250.00 weekly overtime charge will be applied until all graduation requirements are met.

Teaching Methods

Instructional methods include classroom lectures and demonstrations for theory, laboratory instruction and supervision, field trips, evaluation and advising, academic classes in each subject, and clinic operations. The Esthetic Excellence Academy is equipped with audio-visual training aids, tapes, and DVDs to enhance learning; however, these aids supplement but do not replace classroom instructors.

Frequently Asked Questions

Payments, Fees, and Student Requirements

1. What payment methods are accepted?

Payments can be made by cash, money order, cashier's check, credit card (with a 3% processing fee), or via the academy's invoicing system (also with a 3% processing fee).

2. When are payments due?

Students are responsible for paying the total program amount as agreed upon enrollment. Payments must be made before 5:00 PM on the 5th of each month to avoid a 10% late fee.

3. Are books, kits, uniforms, or materials refundable?

No, all books, kits, uniforms, and materials purchased are non-refundable and cannot be returned.

4. What additional fees should students expect?

- State Board Written Exam Fee: Paid directly to the Prov testing center after completing 600 clock hours. Contact the Department of Health – Cosmetology Section for current fee information. The current fee per test is \$78.
- State Licensing Practical Exam Fee: \$60 payable to Esthetic Excellence Academy, or subject to change if tested at another approved site.
- Overtime Fees (Electrology students): Electrology students may miss up to 30 hours without penalty. After exceeding the contract date, a charge of \$250.00 per week applies.
- Uniform Costs: School-issued uniform t-shirt (\$20+), jacket (\$65+), name tag (\$15).

5. Where can students take their practical exams?

Students may take the State Licensing Practical Exam at Esthetic Excellence Academy or any other state-approved facility.

6. What are the uniform requirements?

All students must wear a school-issued uniform t-shirt or jacket, which should be purchased before class begins. EEA Lab Coats are not required. Black scrub bottoms and black shoes are required.
