¹For we know that if the tent that is our earthly home is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. ² For in this tent we groan, longing to put on our heavenly dwelling, ³ if indeed by putting it on we may not be found naked. ⁴ For while we are still in this tent, we groan, being

burdened—not that we would be unclothed, but that we would be further clothed, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. ⁵ He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who has given us the Spirit as a guarantee.

⁶ So we are always of good courage. We know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, ⁷ for we walk by faith, not by sight.

⁷ He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth.

Pastoral Prayer

Sacrament of Communion

Sacraments are visible signs of the invisible grace of God - what Christ does by his Holy Spirit within us. Communion (also called the Lord's Supper or the Eucharist), as the distribution of the elements of bread and wine, symbolizes a meal. Communion is a sign of fellowship. That sign signifies more than just the future heavenly fellowship that is to come. The outward sign signifies the inner reality that sinners already experience fellowship with God in the Spirit because of Jesus. Communion is not a meal for good people. It functions as a renewing seal to desperate sinners of that fellowship we have with our holy and gracious God.

You will be invited to come forward. If you are not a Christian we encourage you to spend this time in reflection on what you've seen and heard in the worship. Children who have not received their first communion are welcome and encouraged to come forward with their families to witness their partaking. We invite children who are ready to make a public profession of faith in Christ to arrange a meeting with the elders, and thus become "communicants" at the Lord's Table.

Pastor: The Lord be with you. **People: And also with you.** Pastor: Lift up your hearts!

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People: It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

<u>Prayer of Thanksgiving and Words of Institution</u> Pastor: Let us proclaim the mystery of the faith:

People: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Hallelujah!

Pastor: Christ, our Passover, has been sacrificed for us. Hallelujah!

People: Therefore, let us keep the feast.Pastor: The gifts of God for the people of God.

KIDS' LESSON


Magic Eye posters. Do you remember them? Have you ever seen one? It's a picture, a two dimensional image that can create the optical illusion of a three dimensional image. So the picture looks like just a bunch of pixelated nonsense but if you stare at it long enough you see a hidden image. So you stare and stare and then finally, if you're lucky, a hidden 3d image of a dolphin or a sailboat or whatever would pop out at you and you'd finally get it. You'd hear people saying, "I don't see it, what is it?" And for those that can't see it, they get angry and frustrated and walk away talking about how dumb and pointless the whole thing is. The cross of Jesus is like that.

Non-Christians look at the cross of Jesus and think it's sad and foolish and dumb. But in the church we Christians look at Jesus on the cross and see Jesus dying not for Jesus' sins but for our sins. On the cross we see our Savior about to die, but he's not going to remain dead. When we look at the cross we see our salvation, that Jesus died to beat death and to beat sin for us. When we look at the cross now we know it is empty and that Jesus is risen and alive and reigning as King in his kingdom in heaven. And because he lives, we too will live forever with him.




