\*Reading of Scripture | Matthew 3:1-17 | Rev. Blake Arnoult God reveals himself and his work and speaks to us his people through his Word.

3<sup>1</sup> In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, <sup>2</sup> "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." <sup>3</sup> For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said,

"The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.'"

- <sup>4</sup> Now John wore a garment of camel's hair and a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. <sup>5</sup> Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan were going out to him, <sup>6</sup> and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.
- <sup>7</sup> But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father,' for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children for Abraham. Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

<sup>11</sup> "I baptize you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. <sup>12</sup> His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

<sup>13</sup> Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to John, to be baptized by him. <sup>14</sup> John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" <sup>15</sup> But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. <sup>16</sup> And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; <sup>17</sup> and behold, a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

# Sacrament of Communion

Sacraments are visible signs of the invisible grace of God - what Christ does by his Holy Spirit within us. Communion (also called the Lord's Supper or the Eucharist), as the distribution of the elements of bread and wine, symbolizes a meal. Communion is a sign of fellowship. That sign signifies more than just the future heavenly fellowship that is to come. The outward sign signifies the inner reality that sinners already experience fellowship with God in the Spirit because of Jesus. Communion is not a meal for good people. It functions as a renewing seal to desperate sinners of that fellowship we have with our holy and gracious God.

You will be invited to come forward. If you are not a Christian we encourage you to spend this time in reflection on what you've seen and heard in the worship. Children who have not received their first communion are welcome and encouraged to come forward with their families to witness their partaking. We invite children who are ready to make a public profession of faith in Christ to arrange a meeting with the elders, and thus become "communicants" at the Lord's Table.

Pastor: The Lord be with you. **People: And also with you.** Pastor: Lift up your hearts!

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People: It is right to give him thanks and praise.** 

<u>Prayer of Thanksgiving and Words of Institution</u> Pastor: Let us proclaim the mystery of the faith:

People: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Hallelujah!

Pastor: Christ, our Passover, has been sacrificed for us. Hallelujah!

**People: Therefore, let us keep the feast.**Pastor: The gifts of God for the people of God.

A communion prayer for those searching for the truth:

Give me the ability to follow you no matter what it might cost me. Give me an understanding for you that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

# KIDS' LESSON

Kids, can y'all think of something bad being good?

- -Going to dentist, getting braces
- -The click click of a roller coaster as it climbs up the track
- -Just roller coasters = seem like a terrible idea but they're awesome
- -Relocating a dislocated shoulder, setting a broken bone, getting a shot
- -Having surgery and the doctor has to cut into you

When I was in kindergarten I was running through the hallway to the playground outside and on the door the latch was broken and it sliced open my leg and had to get stitches. My dad is a doctor so he was giving me stitches and I thought it hurt worse than the cut and I was screaming at my dad to stop!!! "You're killing me!!" But the cut was much worse! Those stitches even though they seemed bad were good!

How about meeting God? Do you think that would be a good thing or a bad thing?

What if I told you that God was right behind this curtain and he wants you, just you to come up stage and meet him? I don't know if that scares you a bit but if you would have asked God's people in the Old Testament if they wanted to meet God they would have said, YES but NO WAY!

#### Why?

Because God is so good and holy and we are not good and holy and God can't be around things that are not good and holy.

It's like God is like fire. Can you put your hand in fire without getting burned? Who wants to stand before God for judgment when they die?

No way! Because none of us love God perfectly, none of us love other people perfectly. Well, so how then do we get to be with God? How can anyone be with God in heaven? Because of Jesus. In the Gospel of Matthew we're going to read about John the Baptist talking about judgment which is what baptism is really all about. And Jesus is going to come along and get baptized by John to say that he, Jesus, takes our baptism judgment for us. We can be with God in heaven because Jesus took our judgment for all our sin and all our failures for us on the cross which Jesus calls his real baptism. Jesus took the flood of fire of judgment for us!



Everyone has to be judged by God but if you believe in Jesus then you go through the judgment water and fire with Jesus but you don't drown, you don't get burned because he takes your punishment for your sin and you get his reward for his goodness!

The gospel of Matthew tells us about the good news of this promise that Jesus saved us and we can now live with God who is so holy and good forever!


