- ¹² Now when he heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew into Galilee. ¹³ And leaving Nazareth he went and lived in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, ¹⁴ so that what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

15 "The land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, the way of the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles—
 16 the people dwelling in darkness have seen a great light,
 and for those dwelling in the region and shadow of death, on them a light has dawned."

Sacrament of Communion

Sacraments are visible signs of the invisible grace of God - what Christ does by his Holy Spirit within us. Communion (also called the Lord's Supper or the Eucharist), as the distribution of the elements of bread and wine, symbolizes a meal. Communion is a sign of fellowship. That sign signifies more than just the future heavenly fellowship that is to come. The outward sign signifies the inner reality that sinners already experience fellowship with God in the Spirit because of Jesus. Communion is not a meal for good people. It functions as a renewing seal to desperate sinners of that fellowship we have with our holy and gracious God.

You will be invited to come forward. If you are not a Christian we encourage you to spend this time in reflection on what you've seen and heard in the worship. Children who have not received their first communion are welcome and encouraged to come forward with their families to witness their partaking. We invite children who are ready to make a public profession of faith in Christ to arrange a meeting with the elders, and thus become "communicants" at the Lord's Table.

KIDS' LESSON

What's the best part about summer? No tests? Why do teachers give us tests? To test your smarts. To test if you understand what you're learning. Tests tell us who's right and who's wrong. There are all kinds of tests.

In the Bible there is a kind of test called trial by combat. When two people or two groups disagree with each other you can have a trial by combat where the two sides fight to see who is right and who is dead. Kind of like in the old west when two cowboys would challenge each other to a duel. This is just like David and Goliath - two champions fighting for their side. The belief was God would help the person who was right win the fight.


In Matthew 4 Jesus goes into the wilderness desert where Satan shows up to tempt Jesus. This is a trial by combat and the two champions are Jesus (the champion of good) and Satan (the champion of evil).

What do you think they're fighting about?

Satan challenges Jesus that he won't really do what he said he would do after the Fall and save his people. Satan says everyone belongs to him. But Satan also says he'll give everyone back to Jesus if Jesus will give up on his mission and just worship Satan. Satan is tempting Jesus to side with him instead of his Heavenly Father and choose not to go to the cross. Jesus refuses and overcomes Satan's temptations and beats him there in the wilderness. But Jesus doesn't stop. Jesus gives his life for us and goes all the way to the cross to give his death for us. His life for our life. His death for our death. Jesus accomplishes our salvation for us! God now tests us his people - will we trust that gospel to save us. Satan now tempts us as God's people - don't trust in that gospel to save you. Not only can we resist the devil's temptations to sin knowing God loves us and that's enough for us BUT when we do sin, we know we can have forgiveness with God because of Jesus.
