Sacrament of Communion

Sacraments are visible signs of the invisible grace of God - what Christ does by his Holy Spirit within us. Communion (also called the Lord's Supper or the Eucharist), as the distribution of the elements of bread and wine, symbolizes a meal. Communion is a sign of fellowship. That sign signifies more than just the future heavenly fellowship that is to come. The outward sign signifies the inner reality that sinners already experience fellowship with God in the Spirit because of Jesus. Communion is not a meal for good people. It functions as a renewing seal to desperate sinners of that fellowship we have with our holy and gracious God.

You will be invited to come forward. If you are not a Christian we encourage you to spend this time in reflection on what you've seen and heard in the worship. Children who have not received their first communion are welcome and encouraged to come forward with their families to witness their partaking. We invite children who are ready to make a public profession of faith in Christ to arrange a meeting with the elders, and thus become "communicants" at the Lord's Table.

SERMON NOTES



In the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 7 Jesus tells us not to judge other people. And he gives us a gross example of what he means. He says imagine someone has a large plank of wood stuck in their eye, like a 2x4. Gross. And imagine they come up to you and they've got this 2x4 sticking out of their eye and all of a sudden they start barking at you that you've got some little eyelash in your eye and they rudely say that you look and sound like a moron because of it.

That would be ridiculous right??!! Yes!! That's Jesus' point. If

you've got a large piece of wood sticking out of your eye = that would blind you so how could you see a speck in someone else's' eye!!!

Jesus says the mean, rude person in the church is quick to complain about other people's mistakes BUT they're BLINDED by their own junk and sin. Jesus warns us not to be judgmental like this in the church or in the world with other people.

Being mean to other people will never change other people for the better. Being mean to someone will not bring them closer to Jesus. People who are doing something wrong need the grace of Jesus. People who are sinning need the gospel of Jesus that says Jesus died for our sins to save us from our sins. And we need to remember we need Jesus as much as anyone before we ever tell someone else they need Jesus.
