Sacrament of Communion

Sacraments are visible signs of the invisible grace of God - what Christ does by his Holy Spirit within us. Communion (also called the Lord's Supper or the Eucharist), as the distribution of the elements of bread and wine, symbolizes a meal. Communion is a sign of fellowship. That sign signifies more than just the future heavenly fellowship that is to come. The outward sign signifies the inner reality that sinners already experience fellowship with God in the Spirit because of Jesus. Communion is not a meal for good people. It functions as a renewing seal to desperate sinners of that fellowship we have with our holy and gracious God.

You will be invited to come forward. If you are not a Christian we encourage you to spend this time in reflection on what you've seen and heard in the worship. Children who have not received their first communion are welcome and encouraged to come forward with their families to witness their partaking. We invite children who are ready to make a public profession of faith in Christ to arrange a meeting with the elders, and thus become "communicants" at the Lord's Table.

SERMON NOTES



True story. A little 3 year old boy fell into a glass door and it broke and it cut him. The glass cut his arm and side in 3 big places. He's parents rushed him to the hospital.

When you have a bad cut, the doctor has to sew you back together. And it hurts.

Now, one thing about this boy. He loves the Hulk. Do you know the superhero Bruce Banner who gets angry and turns into a rage monster, the Hulk. He likes to play like he is the Hulk and he'll walk around yelling, "Uggggghhhh, no Banner, only Hulk." And the boy will smash things.

So when the doctor starts stitching him up he is getting angry. So his mom and dad are telling the boy, "Son, stay Banner, stay Banner, stay Banner." And the boy is saying, "ok ok ok....ugghh ugghhh..." "Look at us, look at mommy and daddy. Stay Banner, stay Banner." And the boy is all, "Ugghhhh, ok ok uggghhhh." And the boy did it. He stayed Banner, he stayed himself and didn't turn into the Hulk.

Now, that's really amazing because the boy must have been thinking, "Mom, dad what are you doing? Who is this doctor person and why are you just letting them hurt my arm like this?!?!?!?"

Jesus is going to tell us about anger today in the Sermon on the Mount in the Gospel of Matthew. No matter what happens to us, even if we think people are being mean to us and hurting us we have to believe that Jesus is still loving us and taking care of us. When we're hurting and scared Jesus is saying to us, "Look at me, stay Banner, don't get all mad and crazy and Hulk out. Look at me."

And we're going to hear that even when it looks like you might die you don't have to be scared. And you can trust Jesus because Jesus took the worst suffering and sickness and even your death itself on the cross so that no matter what happens to you in this life - Jesus is taking care of you and loving you. And even when you die it just means you're going to heaven to live forever.
