KIDS' LESSON

Do y'all know what the word "inevitable" means? Inevitable means something WILL happen. Can you think of something that WILL definitely happen? What is inevitable?

The Marvel villain, Thanos, liked to say that he was inevitable, meaning whatever he wanted to happen he would definitely make happen. But then the good guys defeated Thanos so he's not all that inevitable.

Earlier this year we thought the Astros were inevitable - like the Astros will definitely win the World Series this year. That definitely did not happen.

What about death? Is your death inevitable? Yes? Maybe? What could happen in our lifetime before you die? Jesus could come back.

AND THAT is the ONE true inevitability. Jesus is coming back. We may not be able to say anything else in this life will definitely happen except Jesus is coming back.

And our passage today in Matthew 23-24 tell us that because Jesus has already won our salvation with his life and with his death and with his resurrection, the next big thing the Bible says will happen is Jesus' return. That's what we're holding out hope for. That's what we're waiting for.

It will be the best day ever, better than any holiday, vacay day you can think of. The best day of your life will be the day when Jesus comes back.

And right now, what you're supposed to do is believe in Jesus! Being prepared for Jesus' return looks like you waiting here and believing the gospel that Jesus died for your sins and you are saved by believing in him, not yourself.

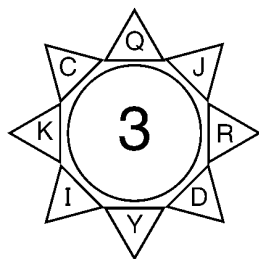
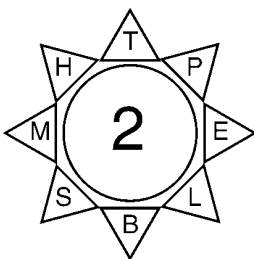
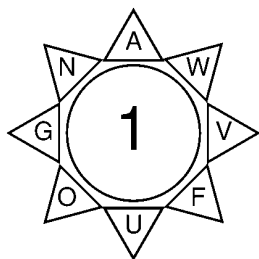
