About the Organization

Located on a secluded, lush 17-acre property in SE Portland's underserved Lents community, Leach Botanical Garden is a unique urban oasis. The Garden's mission is to maintain and enhance living collections of plants for the purposes of education, research, and conservation. In addition to providing general garden access, Leach Botanical Garden produces a broad array of educational and cultural events and programs aimed at serving families and people of all ages and backgrounds. The Garden is an environmental oasis for humans, animals, plants, and the entire ecosystem, providing critical tree canopy and access to nature for the mental and physical health of our neighbors and community. Our 'Back 5' project is a collaborative partnership in habitat restoration and native planting with a focus on underserved youth and BIPOC communities.

Leach Botanical Garden is operated by the non-profit Leach Garden Friends in partnership with Portland Parks & Recreation.

About the role

Leach Botanical Garden is looking for a Gardener to join the Horticulture team. The Gardener will perform all maintenance needs required throughout the 17-acre botanical garden. This is a year-round position with significant physical demands that will require working in all weather conditions. The Gardener will work alongside staff gardeners and volunteers and will report to the Horticulture Director.

About Our Team

Leach Botanical Garden staff take joy in sharing this unique and beautiful garden with our community and visitors and are excited to offer meaningful programming that improves life in our neighborhood, our city, and our world. Responsibilities

- All aspects of garden maintenance for formal garden areas including: cleaning, weeding, watering, pruning, lawn care, pathway maintenance, fertilization, IPM, irrigation repair, tool and equipment care
- Build and support weekly volunteer teams providing basic garden maintenance tasks
- Planning and design for seasonal installations and growing plant collections
- Lead tours and teach classes focusing on best home gardening practices
- Assist with accurate and timely plant record-keeping of the permanent plant collections
- Work as a cohesive member of the gardening team and keep a positive attitude
- Observe and work within all safety guidelines and procedures laid out by the organization
- Other duties as assigned

Skills, Knowledge, and Abilities

The Gardener should have at least 2 years of experience working in a garden maintenance setting. Additionally, strong knowledge and understanding of best horticultural practices for the Pacific Northwest climate is desirable. Below are key skills that will enhance a candidate's ability to succeed in this role:

- Ability to perform intense physical labor in all weather conditions and work in an environment with occasional loud noise
- Capable of using power tools such as leaf blowers, mowers, and string trimmers
- Ability to repeatedly lift up to 50 lbs and maneuver heavy items
- Comfortable engaging with the public to provide a positive visitor experience
- Enjoy working as part of a team while also working alone for extended periods of time
- Keep open, honest, and timely communication with coworkers and supervisors
- Arrive for work on time for scheduled hours
- Keep a professional demeanor, work well under pressure, and complete all work assigned to the high standard expected of the garden department
- Bring a sense of joy to the workplace and passion for the work that you do
- Ability to bring creativity and flexibility to problem-solving
- Ability to prioritize and juggle multiple projects in a fluid working environment
- A commitment to equity, diversity, inclusion, accessibility, and a willingness to collaborate to support and prioritize these values
- Passion for healthy ecosystems, sustainable landscapes, and building resilience in the face of climate change
