**WHEREAS:** The Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes are a federally recognized Indian tribes organized pursuant to a Constitution approved by tribal membership on April 4, 2006 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior; and,

**WHEREAS:** Article VI, Section 5(a) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the “power to make all laws and resolutions in accordance with the Constitution which are necessary and proper for the good of the Tribes;” and,

**WHEREAS:** Article VII, Section 4(d) of the Constitution requires that the Legislature or Tribal Council give prior authorization for the signing of contracts by the Governor; and,

**WHEREAS:** The Tribes have identified a need for these camps and to enter into a contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs for twelve beginning September 1, 2025 through August 31, 2026; and

**WHEREAS:** In accordance with 25 CFR § 900.8 (d) an “authorizing resolution” is required from the Tribes; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that The Tenth Legislature of the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes approves and authorizes the Governor, Reggie Wassana, to sign a new BIA contract for one (1) BIA program for a period of twelve months of funding to be under the Department of Language and Culture and not the EPA Program.

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that the Governor is directed and authorized to carry out all acts necessary and proper to implement the intent of this resolution.



1. The program will service the following geographic area: **Concho**
  2. The estimated number of Indian people who will receive the benefits or services under the proposed contract: **Thirty (30) youth, ranging from ages eleven (11) - twenty-five (25);**
  3. An identification of any local, Area, regional, or national level departmental programs, functions, services or activities to be contracted, including administrative functions: **K-State Great Plains Fire Science Exchange will help tribal staff with information to teach tribal youth about natural resources and explore these subjects from September 2025 through August 2026;**
  4. A description of the proposed program standards: **The Cheyenne and Arapaho**

**Tribes are focusing on educating their tribal youth about the importance of natural resource management and how it affects the tribes' natural resources on land, in the air, the water, and the wildlife. By understanding different types of natural resources, the youth can apply these teachings and further their interest in having a career in natural resources;**

5. An Identification of the program reports, data and financial reports that the Indian tribe or tribal organization will provide, including their frequency: **Yearly reports are due on September 1, 2026, and the final close-out report of the grant in November 1, 2026;**
6. A description of any proposed redesign of the program's services, functions, or activities to be contracted: **One (1) consultant to organize youth camp, training materials, and curriculum;**
7. Minimum staff qualifications proposed by the Indian tribe and Tribal organization, if any: **all tribal staff that are helping with this program will have experience in their field of expertise involving fire, language and culture, agriculture, and working with the tribal youth; and**
8. A statement that the Indian tribe or tribal organization will meet the minimum procurement, property and financial management standards set forth in subpart F, subject to any waiver that may have been granted under subpart K. **The Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes Manual of Personnel Policies, the Property and Supply Manual, the Procurement Policy, and the Financial Management Handbook are on file with the Bureau of Indian Affairs.**
