S SUBJECT: A Resolution to Appropriate Funds to the Food Pantry to Provide Services to Tribal Members that Reside Outside the state of Oklahoma.

WHEREAS: The Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes are duly recognized by the United States Secretary of the Interior as a self-governing, Sovereign Nation, that is a federally recognized Indian Tribe with all rights, privileges, and powers attended thereto as a sovereign government, and organized in accordance with Title 25 of the United States Code, Section 450, the "Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act," and Article XVII of the Tribe's Constitution and By-Laws and Section 3 of the Oklahoma Indian Welfare Act of June 26, 1936 (49 Stat. 1967), under an amended Constitution ratified on August, 2006 and approved by the Secretary of Interior on May 17, 2006; and

- **WHEREAS**: Article VI, Section 5(a) of the Constitution provides that the Legislative power shall be vested in the Legislature; and
- **WHEREAS**: Article VI, Section 5(a) of the Constitution grants the Legislature the power to make laws and resolutions in accordance with the Constitution which are necessary and proper for the good of the Tribes; and
- **WHEREAS:** The Tenth Legislature of the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes is aware of the importance of ensuring that all Tribal Members are provided equal opportunity to services offered by the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes; and
- WHEREAS: The Tenth Legislature of the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes recognizes that Tribal Members that reside outside of the state of Oklahoma may miss out on local holiday events (e.g. food drives for holidays) offered to Tribal Members that reside within Legislative Districts; and

WHEREAS: The Tenth Legislature of the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes determines it is in the best interest of the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes to appropriate funds to the Food Pantry to make a one-time distribution of gift cards in the amount of \$50 to Tribal Members within the ages of 18 to 54 that reside outside the state of Oklahoma for the upcoming Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday; and

WHEREAS: The Food Pantry for the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes shall administer the onetime purchase and distribution of \$50 gift cards to Eligible Tribal Members for the purpose of providing out of state Tribal Members with funds to purchase Thanksgiving and Christmas meals. To be eligible for receipt, the Tribal Member at the time of applying for the gift card, must be fully enrolled, reside outside of the state of Oklahoma, and be 18 to 54 years of age. Eligible Tribal Members shall receive no more than one gift card; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tenth Legislature of the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribe, pursuant to its Constitutional authority, determines that it is in the best interest of the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes to appropriate \$100,000 and any additional administrative costs (i.e. temporary/seasonal workers, gift card fees, mailing fees) to carry out this resolution, from tax commission funds to the Food Pantry to make a one-time distribution of \$50 Gift Cards to Tribal Members 18 to 54 years old that reside outside the state of Oklahoma; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Food Pantry shall develop an application form that complies with the requirements above, enabling Tribal Members to submit their applications for a gift card. The gift cards shall be distributed on a first-come first-serve basis until all available gift cards have been allotted to applicants who meet the above-specified requirements, any funds not expended for this purpose shall be returned to the General Fund for subsequent appropriation.

Pursuant to Article VI, Section 7, subsection (a)(iv) of the Tribes Constitution reads in part: "All Bills passed by the Legislature shall be presented to the Governor for signature or veto. All laws shall take effect thirty days after signature by the Governor or veto override by the Legislature unless any Member of the Tribes submits to the Coordinator of the Office of Tribal Council a petition signed by at least one hundred fifty Members of the Tribal Council seeking to repeal the law or resolution at the next Tribal Council meeting. If the Tribal Council fails to repeal such law or resolution at the next Tribal Council where the matter has been properly placed on the agenda for the Tribal Council meeting, such law or resolution shall become effective immediately."

Pursuant to Article VII, Section 4, subsection (g) of the Tribes Constitution reads: "The Governor shall have the power to sign any enactment passed by the Legislature into law or to veto any enactment passed by the Legislature within ten days of passage with a written explanation of any objections; and if the Governor takes no action within ten days, then the enactment shall become law in accordance with this Constitution."
