t was a rainy Saturday afternoon. Jackie and I had just completed our weekly shop in Tesco's and were heading to our car. As I pushed the trolley around the back of the car, I heard someone say something. I turned and saw a lady standing in the rain nearby, crying. Through her tears she mumbled, 'Do you have a pound?'

Jackie talked to her. The story was that she had lost her bank card and didn't have the money to get back to Kidderminster where she had parked her car. Once she realised that her card was missing, she had cancelled it with her bank and therefore couldn't use her phone to buy a ticket. I explained that we didn't carry money, but I rummaged around in my car and found a couple of pound coins.

As it was raining, and the train station was about a mile away, we asked her if she would like a lift. She gladly got into the car and on the way told us her name. I asked if she now had sufficient money to buy a ticket on the train, but she didn't. I eventually gave her enough money for the ticket, along with a booklet called, 'Turn to God.' As she left the car, she thanked us, and we watched her walk quickly into the station. After many years of working with people, I wished I had had more time to ask other questions. I just hoped that, as our car disappeared, she didn't turn around and make her way back up to the Tesco's car park!

As we enter December and read again the Christmas narrative, there are always questions that I wonder about. How long did it take Mary and Joseph to travel to Bethlehem? Were they with other family members? How did the conversation with

the inn keeper go? Did he wonder why Joseph had brought someone on a long journey so close to delivering her baby? What did he think about the bunch of shepherds turning up?

I like to think that the inn keeper had compassion on this young couple and generously guided them to the stable, but of course I don't know. We do know that on that night long ago the angels visited the shepherds and gave them a free concert. 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord.'

I think I would have liked to have been one of those shepherds! To see the sky filled with the heavenly host and hear them praising God. Their hearts must have pulsated as they rushed to Bethlehem and found, as they had been told, a babe in the manger. But no ordinary baby. In front of them was the Christ, the anointed one of God, the looked for Messiah, the Lord. Their response was to tell as many people as they could about Jesus.

As we approach Christmas, may we all be like the shepherds and tell as many people as we can the good news of great joy about Jesus being the only Saviour of the world. Pray that the Lord will bless all our efforts this December, and please pray for the lady that we met in the Tesco's car park.

The hopes and fears

I love singing Christmas carols. I wish we could sing them all the year round! A line in *O little town of Bethlehem* goes, 'The hopes and fears of all the years are met in you tonight.' The writer is saying that the coming of Jesus into the world brought a new hope to overcome humanity's fears.

During this past 12 months staff and volunteers at the Care Centre have listened to many stories of humanity's fears, and I am regularly provided with homelessness data, both regionally and nationally. Sadly, it does not make pleasant reading.

Currently, in Birmingham alone, 27,504 households are on the local authority waiting list. 5, 500 families and 12,000 children are in temporary accommodation, with 2,000 children living in bed and breakfasts. Nationally, 3.12 million people are using food banks.

Every day in the UK, 4 homeless people die, with the majority of deaths linked to suicide or drugs.

However, I found most deeply disturbing a report published in October by The Museum of Homelessness. It compiled data around homeless deaths. The number of people who died while homeless in the UK in 2024 was 1,611, an increase of 9% on the previous year and a record high. 11 were children. Every day in the UK, 4 homeless people die, with the majority of deaths linked to suicide or drugs.

As I write this BCM are planning to bring some seasonal hope and joy to those who regularly come along to the Care Centre throughout the year. Two Christmas meals will be provided, with 50 people coming along to each one. As well as enjoying a traditional Christmas meal, everyone will receive gifts. And of course we will be singing Christmas carols! Huge thanks to James Brindley Academy for providing the gifts, and to 'I'm homeless, get me out of here' for covering the cost of the turkeys and trimmings.

So, as we move into the advent season, our prayer is that we will bring hope, peace, joy and love to all who come to our Care Centre, especially at this time of year.


