


 Available at most grocery stores, pharmacies, and department stores like Walmart - no prescription needed for external condoms!




HOW TO STORE CONDOMS

Condoms need to be stored away from extreme cold, extreme heat, humidity or direct sunlight.









You also want to keep them somewhere where they won't be moved around or compressed too much. Somewhere like a drawer is ideal – remember to grab one or two before you go out!




EXTERNAL CONDOMS

External condoms cover the penis during sex to collect semen to prevent the spread of STIs. They also cover most skin to prevent skin-to-skin transmission of STIs. Both latex or non-latex options are available (lambskin condoms DO NOT protect against STIs).

HOW TO USE


Place the condom on the head of the penis when it is erect. Hold the tip of the condom and unroll the condom down the shaft of the penis.













Tip!-

If you put on the condom the wrong way and it can't roll down, throw it in the trash (don't flush them!) and get another one. The tip of the penis may have STIs or semen on it which could be transferred to the outside of the condom.

INTERNAL CONDOMS

An internal condom is designed to be placed inside the anus or vagina before sex. Internal condoms can be inserted a few hours before sex.


HOW TO USE


Squeeze the smaller circle and insert it in the vagina or anus by pushing it up and in. The larger circle will remain outside the vagina or anus.























DENTAL DAMS

A dental dam is a thin sheet of latex or polyurethane. It can be placed over the vulva or anus during oral sex to reduce the risk of spreading STIs. Using a dental dam is simple – spread it over the desired area and hold it in place.











Tip! If you can't find a dental dam, you can easily turn an external condom into one. Cut the side and open it out. Then use it like you would a dental dam.











Tip

Not all condoms are the same size and shape! Even having foreskin or not having foreskin can change the user's experience. Research what works best for you.
