#### I. Two Hebrew Words

- 1. <u>harag</u> used for killing (e.g., war)
- 2. <u>ratsah</u> unlawful/unauthorized taking of human life

#### II. Three Reasons We are Commanded Not to Murder

## 1. All humans bear God's image.

So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them.

Genesis 1:27 (NIV)

## 2. Human life is a gift from God.

Then the Lord God formed a man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being.

Genesis 2:7 (NIV)

# 3. We are accountable to God for the lives of fellow humans.

Then the Lord said to Cain, "Where is your brother Abel?"
"I don't know," he replied. "Am I my brother's keeper?"
The Lord said, "What have you done? Listen! Your brother's blood cries out to me from the ground."

Genesis 4:9-10 (NIV)

## III. The Way of Jesus

1. Anger is equated with murder.

"You have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'You shall not murder, and anyone who murders will be subject to judgment.' But I tell you that anyone who is angry with a brother or sister will be subject to judgment. Again, anyone who says to a brother or sister, 'Raca,' is answerable to the court. And anyone who says, 'You fool!' will be in danger of the fire of hell.

## 2. Reconciliation is the heart of the matter.

"...First go and be reconciled to them..."

## 3. The matter is the heart.
