ALLIED ARTS 2025 CAMPAIGN RAISES MORE THAN \$3.8 MILLION

With the close of its fiscal year on June 30, the Allied Arts 2025 campaign raised \$3,881,700 — the most in its 54-year history.

Chaired by Sally and Jeff Starling, this year's record-breaking campaign received support from thousands of generous individual donors, corporate and foundation partners, and the community at large. Allied Arts Visionary donors, contributing \$100,000 or more to the campaign, include: the Chickasaw Nation, the Kirkpatrick Family Fund, Devon Energy, OG&E, and Glenna and Dick Tanenbaum.

Employee giving also played an important part in campaign success with local businesses encouraging their employees to donate collectively in

support of the arts. The 2025 top workplaces include: Continental Resources, OG&E, City of Oklahoma City Employees, Devon Energy, American Fidelity, Robinson Park, Duncan Oil, BancFirst, Employees of the State of Oklahoma, and Bank of Oklahoma.

"The Allied Arts annual campaign means more than just reaching a financial goal. It is a testament to how deeply Oklahomans value creativity, expression and access to artistic experiences," said the Starlings. "Every dollar raised is a private donation, not public dollars, by individuals and businesses committed to the communities in which we live, work and play. And the donations make a difference, a difference allowing our neighbors to gain access to free and low-cost arts programs and experiences; a difference to students receiving vital arts education in their classrooms and afterschool sites; and a difference to communities supporting artistic excellence for all to enjoy."

At the Campaign Progress Celebration event on June 3 at the **Oklahoma City Ballet**, the Starlings thanked **Christian Keesee** and **Larry Keigwin** for serving as Honorary Chairs and recognized volunteers on the Campaign Cabinet for their commitment and tireless dedication to strengthening our local arts nonprofit sector.

YOUR INVESTMENT IN ACTION

With your generous support, Allied Arts distributed \$3.2 million in its last fiscal year to 47 arts nonprofits based in central Oklahoma, with many having a statewide reach. Supported projects include workforce development via film industry workshops, in-school and afterschool arts experiences for low-income students, and healing arts programming for veterans, elderly populations and hospitalized youth.

GRANT DEFEHR RECOGNIZED WITH THE ZACH D. TAYLOR AWARD

At the last board meeting of the 2025 fiscal year, Allied Arts presented **Grant DeFehr**, **Cavalier Development**, with this year's Zach D. Taylor Award. DeFehr has served on the Allied Arts board for more than a decade, working on the annual fundraising campaign, leading the allocations finance process and serving as a grants review panelist. In addition, this year DeFehr sat on the executive committee as treasurer and participated in a benchmarking assessment project.

Named after one of Allied Arts' most tireless volunteers, leaders and advocates, the Zach D. Taylor Volunteer Award was created in 2009 after his untimely passing. The award is given on an annual basis to a volunteer who exhibits the qualities that made Zach a treasured member of the Allied Arts family including accountability, accessibility, inclusiveness, preparedness and receptiveness.

Named after the former Allied Arts president & CEO who served the organization for two decades, the award recognizes a staff member or volunteer from a nonprofit arts agency who has shown a commitment to enhancing access to quality arts education. Celebrating its 45th anniversary this year, **Metropolitan School of Dance**, led by Pitts, trains more than 4,000 students annually through in-school workshops, studio classes and camps, and senior center visits.

As executive director, Pitts ensures that Metropolitan students have a safe place to express their creativity, dream big and use dance as a springboard for life skills training and mentorship.
