Every Saturday night, the Opry band performs with new weekly hosts and local entertainers representing a wide range of genres. Community Music School which provides quality instruction for just 50-cents per class for low-income students and guitar lessons for veterans paired with VAsupported therapy through its Strings of Valor program.

The bus traveled from Bricktown to the Paseo Arts District for a stop at Oklahoma Shakespeare. In addition to touring their intimate Black Box indoor theatre and outdoor Oklahoma Shakespeare Gardens, board members received an interactive lesson on acting out the Bard's historic yet still relevant words. Complementing its year-round theatrical offerings, Oklahoma Shakespeare programs include artists in residence to bring Shakespeare's works to life for young students and a summer theatre camp.

The tour ended in the Plaza District at Lyric Theatre, the award-winning State Theatre of Oklahoma. Board members toured Lyric's prop shop and costume departments, witnessing the behind-the-scenes artistry to bring productions to the stage. Lyric's Musical Interactive program brings live theatre to elementary and middle schools statewide, reaching every Oklahoma county last year and offered at no cost.

Allied Arts will distribute more than \$2.9 million in grants this fiscal year to central Oklahoma arts and culture nonprofits. Of that amount, \$2.45 million has been allocated to the Allied Arts 25 member agencies as unrestricted awards, using the funds where they are most needed to advance their missions. Allocations grants are directed toward the advancement of organizational health and sustainability, youth and family outreach, and ensuring access and inclusion with the arts.

The remaining funds are awarded through the Allied Arts Educational Outreach and Capacity-Building grant programs. In the first grantmaking cycle of the fiscal year, Allied Arts is distributing \$144,975 for youth arts and community outreach projects, and \$67,229 in support of infrastructure growth and strengthening efforts.


