His extensive involvement with the arts includes Allied Arts and many of our agencies including Lyric Theatre, Metropolitan School of Dance, Oklahoma Visual Arts Coalition, Sooner Theatre and Arts Council Oklahoma City where he served as co-chair of the 2023 Festival of the Arts. Joining Jordan and Karim on the campaign leadership team are **Leslie and Cliff Hudson** as the Allied Arts 2026 Honorary Chairs. The Hudson's talent and philanthropy have been directed to many important issues, most notably education, social and economic quality, public health and the arts. Leslie has served as a board member with Allied Arts and the Oklahoma City Museum of Art, while Cliff is currently board chair of Oklahoma City Repertory Theatre. As part of the campaign, Allied Arts will recognize the Hudsons in the spring at the Honorary Chair Event. Donors who contribute \$1,500 or more to the 2026 campaign are invited to attend.

The Allied Arts 2026 campaign kicks off on February 3 as the official start of "Allied Arts Month." A donation at any giving level makes a real difference. For example, a gift of \$25 provides supplies for a student receiving financial assistance to participate in visual art afterschool programming; a contribution of \$50 offsets the cost of offering a dance and movement class for people suffering with Parkinson's disease; and a \$250 donation purchases a guitar for a veteran learning to use music as a tool for healing and finding purpose again.

An Allied Arts member agency, **deadCenter Film** is a hub for arts education, workforce development, community connection and storytelling that inspires, promotes, and celebrates creativity and community through film. In addition to its annual summer festival which serves as an Oscar®-qualifying event, deadCenter has engaged more than 50,000 students through its Statewide Education Tour which serves rural and underserved middle and high schools and technology centers, by introducing filmmaking as both a creative outlet and a viable career path in Oklahoma's expanding film industry.

An arm of its educational outreach, deadCenter University (dCU) brings students together to create short films, under the guidance of professional mentors, which premiere during the Film Festival. The first dCU film has already won multiple awards and was named an Official Selection of the prestigious All American High School Film Festival in New York City.



OPUS XIII: A NEW YORK NIGHT

On November 8, Allied Arts brought lively New York City districts to the Oklahoma City Golf & Country Club with **OPUS XIII Club Cabaret: A New York Night**. Chaired by **Dominique C. & Travis C. Mason** and **Katie & Taylor Shinn**, the 2025 biennial OPUS event brought together more than 450 guests and raised \$630,000, the most generated in any Allied Arts fundraising event.

OPUS immersed guests in Big Apple flair with a Statue of Liberty stilt walker, a street saxophonist, piano jazz lounge and Met-inspired dining room. The extensive cabaret lineup showcased the incredible local talent of Allied Arts-affiliated groups, **Sooner Theatre**, **Oklahoma City Ballet**, **RACE Dance Collective** and **Lyric Theatre**, alongside special guest performances by Broadway star **Meghan Picerno** and **OK3**, the local trio who earned a four-chair turn on The Voice.

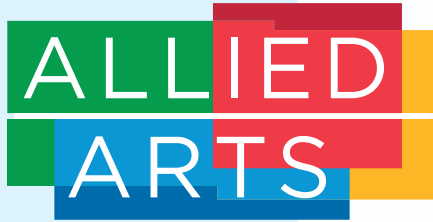


SAVE THE DATE: ARTINI
