CIMARRON OPERA

Community Outreach

The Scholastic Opera Tour visits elementary schools and libraries across Oklahoma with a short educational opera. Cimarron Opera's Festival of Spirituals is a free event celebrating the African American Spiritual. This event has been free since its inception in 1970 and the past four festivals are available at cimarronopera.org.

In partnership with the Adult Wellness and Education Center in Norman, Cimarron offers a monthly Opera Club where community members can watch and discuss opera performances and the AWE-pera Chorus where adults over 50 come together to sing as part of a community chorus, culminating in a performance alongside guest soloists from Cimarron Opera. All of Cimarron's programming is designed to be enjoyable for first time opera goers as well as longtime opera fans.



DEADCENTER FILM (dC)

Volunteer Opportunities

deadCenter Film works with more than 400 volunteers throughout the year. Community Outreach

In recent years, deadCenter (dC) has prioritized efforts to become more inclusive, reach more diverse audiences and feature works by filmmakers from marginalized communities. deadCenter's FREE Continuum programming has become a centerpiece for fulfilling these goals, forging new partnerships, increasing community conversations and sharing the love of film with new groups throughout the OKC Metro. Community discussions generally precede or follow the screenings, enhancing the connection between creators and audiences. For recent screenings, dC has partnered with Afro Cinema Nights, OKC Latino Young Professionals, Matriarch, Oklahoma Pride Alliance, Respect Diversity and First Americans Museum.



FIREHOUSE ART CENTER

Community Outreach

The Firehouse's outreach programming strives to make arts education available to all individuals, regardless of age, ability or socioeconomic status. We pursue this goal through accessibility programming for underserved communities, including the Healing Studio for adults with disabilities, Healing Outreach for individuals at assisted living homes, Firehouse Equality Club for 2SLGBTQIA+ individuals and their families, and Art Forces for U.S. Military Veterans and active service members. The Firehouse also provides drawing instruction at the OKC Zoo through ZOO Sketch, as well as visual arts experiences at local events to encourage visual arts learning, creative thinking and self-expression. Finally, the Firehouse provides free art experiences and programming through the Firehouse Gallery, which presents three in-house exhibitions and three culturally relevant exhibitions each year. Each exhibition provides opportunities for additional community programming, such as musical performances, guest lectures, and artist demonstrations and workshops. All accessibility and outreach programming is offered at no cost to the participants.



LYRIC THEATRE

Community Outreach

Lyric's Musical Interactive is a touring musical production created by Lyric featuring an original script with select songs from an established Broadway musical. The program is offered free of charge to schools statewide. During the 2024-2025 school year, Lyric visited 391 schools, performed 510 times, and served 149,837 students. Musical Interactive was able to visit 61 out of 77 counties in Oklahoma this year.



MABEE-GERRER MUSEUM OF ART

Community Outreach

During the school year, our A Cappella Rocks program may be offered to schools throughout the central Oklahoma area, to educate students about the American art form of barbershop harmony. We also offer our annual Youth In Harmony Workshop, a day-long event available to middle and high school students, where they can learn elements of barbershop harmony and perform a full-length song. Our Journeys In Harmony program, originally developed for the Girl Scouts of Western Oklahoma to earn a Musician badge and a Harmony patch, is now offered by the Sweet Adelines International organization as a model for scouting organizations worldwide. We also provide entertainment/education visits to senior living centers in the metro area.



OKLAHOMA CHILDREN'S THEATRE

Volunteer Opportunities

Our teen volunteers are crucial during our seasonal and summer camps, helping with a variety of tasks like stocking and running the Camp Store, creating weekly programs, assisting classes and Fun Time hours, escorting late/early campers to and from activities, and supporting our before- and after-care teachers. They also help with additional tasks as needed throughout the year. Many of our volunteers have been OCT campers for years and aspire to become teachers' assistants when they are old enough. We also welcome volunteer ushers for our productions, helping greet families, scan tickets, and create a positive theatre-going experience.

In addition, we host an annual volunteer day at our prop and costume warehouse, an opportunity to roll up your sleeves and help us organize, build and refresh the tools that bring our shows to life. Our next warehouse volunteer day is tentatively scheduled for **April 17, 2026**.

Community Outreach

Oklahoma Children's Theatre's outreach efforts are vital to the organization's mission, delivering arts education and theatre performances to schools entirely free of charge through two major programs. Our in-school residencies build foundational performing skills, confidence and teamwork in a supportive, creative setting. Our rural tours bring the magic of live theatre to children across the state who typically lack access to arts education.



OKLAHOMA CITY BALLET

Community Outreach

Oklahoma City Ballet's community engagement programs serve over 20,000 youth and seniors within Oklahoma. We're committed to providing experiences that increase the understanding and appreciation of ballet, as well as a lifelong interest in the arts. These programs provide our community with beauty, inspiration and art that enriches lives and comforts souls.

Programming includes Dance Discovery – on-site dance instruction at underserved schools and the Boys and Girls Club of Oklahoma County; ArtsReach – an arts education program offered to all Oklahoma schools that culminates in a live performance of The Nutcracker at Civic Center Music Hall; Golden Swans – ballet classes for older adults; and Dance for Parkinson's – a special class geared towards people with Parkinson's disease.

OKC Ballet also offers free performances for schools and other organizations across the community. All Community Engagement programs are offered at no cost to the participants.



OKLAHOMA CITY MUSEUM OF ART (OKCMOA)

Community Outreach

Since 2012, the Oklahoma City Museum of Art has partnered with local hospitals to bring artmaking and creative connection to those unable to visit the Museum in person. Through Healing Arts at SSM Behavioral Health in Midtown and Midwest City, a Museum Teaching Artist leads monthly art sessions for approximately 100 children, teens and adults. Each visit provides a welcoming space for creative expression, conversation and reflection inspired by artworks from OKCMOA's permanent collection and special exhibitions. The Museum also partners with OU Children's Hospital to offer Museum Mondays, a monthly come-and-go artmaking program, as well as several annual atrium events designed for pediatric patients and their families.

Making Memories is OKCMOA's program designed for individuals living with Alzheimer's disease and other forms of dementia and their caregivers. The program connects participants with art – and with one another – through conversation and creative artmaking inspired by the Museum's permanent collection and special exhibitions. OKCMOA also offers a Virtual Field Trip program for teachers and students which brings free gallery experiences live to their classrooms. Babies at the Museum offers a fun-filled thirty minutes in front of the month's featured work of art, ending with playtime in the Family Space.



OKLAHOMA CITY PHILHARMONIC (OKCPHIL)

Community Outreach

The Veterans and Active Military Initiative offers free, recurring arts experiences for veterans and active-duty service members. Programs include ceramics, printmaking and other studio-based workshops led by professional teaching artists. These sessions center on creative exploration, wellbeing and connection within the veteran community.

Classrooms can schedule a free field trip that includes transportation, a guided exhibition tour and a hands-on art-making experience. These visits are part of ARTS LAB programming, which focuses on arts integration and was developed in partnership with educators.
