

#### SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME **BE CAREFUL WHAT YOU ASK FOR**

Jesus talks about praying for whatever we need with faith and confidence, but he ends by asking, "How much more will the Father ... give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?" (Luke 1:13). Is he saying there are limits to what we can ask for?

"Be careful what you ask for," the saying warns. Just because we want something doesn't mean it will be good for us. Remember the Indiana Jones movies? The artifact that the bad guys were seeking usually turned out to be lethal. But if we have enough faith to pray for something, we probably would not pray for anything evil. So what is Jesus really saying? He is giving us two lessons about prayer.

First, he assures us that God does hear our prayers and answers them. Many people take "ask and you shall receive" so literally that they expect God to do their bidding no matter what they want. Prayers, however, are not a magical ritual that somehow forces God to do our will. God is free to do what is best for us, free to answer some prayers with a no when what we seek is against God's will. So maybe our first prayer should be to ask God to show us what we really need.

That leads us to the second lesson: prayer changes us, not God. If we truly pray as Jesus prayed, we would ask for what we need, adding, "Not as I will, but as you will" (Matthew 26:39). If we pray humbly and are open to what God wills for us, we will begin to see that what we really need most is actually God. It's not easy to change our minds about what we want or need. To change our desires from selfish to holy takes a lot of power, the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus was raised from the dead by that power and we will be, too (Romans 8:11). Mary conceived by the power of the Spirit (Matthew 1:18). The bread and wine of the Eucharist become the Body and Blood of Christ by the Spirit's power. So when Jesus promises that the Father will give the Spirit to us for the asking, the Spirit is both the source of and the answer to our prayers. Let us ask the Spirit to empower us to desire and pray for what we really need. Tom Schmidt





Bishop William A. Wack, CSC is pleased to share with the faithful his second pastoral letter, **Reborn, Anointed, Nourished: Faith and Formation for Life**, as the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee prepares to restore the proper order of the sacraments of initiation for Catholics baptized before the age of discretion. Reborn, Anointed, Nourished provides the theological, historical and pastoral rationale for this transition in sacramental practice that will take shape in the coming years.


He offered the following comments upon the letter's release: "It is my joy to share with you my vision for a renewal of sacramental life in the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee, and a renewal of faith in Jesus Christ in our families. In this Pastoral Letter, I wish to explain my decision to move the age of Confirmation for Catholic children from the ninth or tenth grade to what is called in church law 'the age of discretion,' around seven years of age.

This endeavor, rooted deeply in the Church's ancient tradition and the profound wisdom of her liturgical practice, seeks to administer the three sacraments of

initiation in their proper sequence: Baptism, followed by Confirmation, and then First Eucharist. This letter, born of much prayer and discernment, articulates our diocesan vision for family catechesis and the Sacraments of Initiation.

It is a truly pivotal moment for our local Church. It is, without a doubt, a vibrant testament to the ceaseless activity of the Holy Spirit in our midst—the same Spirit who continually calls us to deeper holiness and impels us toward greater evangelization."

Wack, CSC, se complace en compartir con los fieles su segunda carta pastoral, Renacidos, Ungidos, y Alimentados: Fe y Formación de por Vida, mientras la Diócesis de Pensacola-Tallahassee se prepara para restaurar el orden correcto de los sacramentos de iniciación para los católicos bautizados antes de la edad de discreción. Renacidos, Ungidos, y Alimentados ofrece la justificación teológica, histórica y pastoral de esta transición en la práctica sacramental que se concretará en los próximos años.

Tras la publicación de la carta, ofreció los siguientes comentarios: "Me alegra compartir con ustedes mi visión para una renovación de la vida sacramental en la Diócesis de Pensacola-Tallahassee y una renovación de la fe en Jesucristo en nuestras familias. En esta Carta Pastoral, deseo explicar mi decisión de trasladar la edad de la Confirmación para los niños católicos del noveno o décimo grado a lo que la ley eclesiástica denomina 'la edad de la discreción', alrededor de los siete años.

Este esfuerzo, profundamente arraigado en la antigua tradición de la Iglesia y la profunda sabiduría de su práctica litúrgica, busca administrar los tres sacramentos de iniciación en su secuencia correcta: el Bautismo, seguido de la Confirmación y luego la Primera Comunión. Esta carta, fruto de mucha oración y discernimiento, articula nuestra visión diocesana para la catequesis familiar y los

Sacramentos de Iniciación.

Es un momento verdaderamente crucial para nuestra Iglesia local. Es, sin duda, un testimonio vibrante de la incesante actividad del Espíritu Santo en medio de nosotros: el mismo Espíritu. Quien nos llama continuamente a una santidad más profunda y nos impulsa hacia una mayor evangelización.
