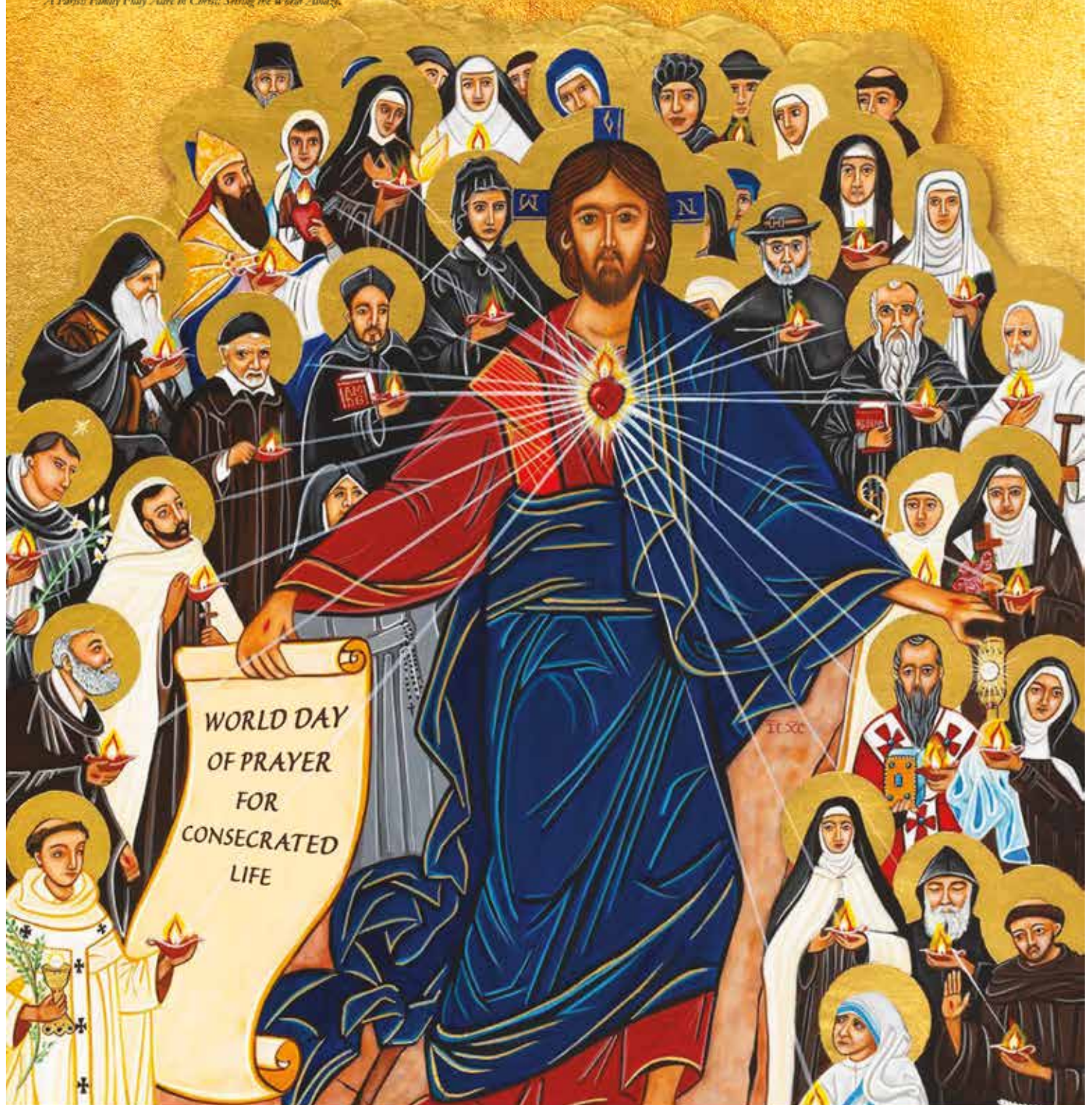

A MESSAGE FROM FR. RICHARD

St. Dominic Family,

I would like to share with you some news regarding an upcoming change in assignment and I wanted you to hear it directly from me. Over the past several weeks, word has begun to travel through the grapevine, and it is important to me that you, my parish family, receive this news firsthand.

After many conversations and much discernment, I have received an assignment from Bishop Wack to pursue a License in Canon Law. In obedience to his request I anticipate beginning these studies in the Fall of 2026 at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.

The study of Canon Law is ordered toward the pastoral mission of the Church and, ultimately, the salvation of souls. Through this formation, I hope to be better equipped to serve the diocese and the People of God, particularly by helping the Church carry out her mission with justice, charity, and fidelity to Christ.

This news certainly comes with mixed emotions. I have loved my time here at St. Dominic, both as a seminarian during the craziness of Hurricane Michael, to my present assignment as your parish priest. I will miss this place, and all of you dearly. You have welcomed me with generosity, patience, and kindness, and it has been a privilege to walk with you and to serve you. St. Dominic has truly been a place that I can call home.

Please know that I remain fully present to my ministry here, and I look forward to continuing our mission together as a parish in the months ahead. Closer to my time of departure, we will plan an opportunity to gather and say a more complete and proper goodbye.

Until then, I ask for your prayers as I prepare for this next chapter, and be assured of my prayers for each of you. I am deeply grateful for your love, support and example of faith. I will always carry St. Dominic Parish with me wherever I go.

WORLD DAY FOR CONSECRATED LIFE



In 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II instituted a day of prayer for women and men in consecrated life. **This celebration is attached to the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd. This Feast is also known as Candlemas Day; the day on which candles are blessed symbolizing Christ who is the light of the world.** So too, those in consecrated life are called to reflect the light of Jesus Christ to all peoples. The celebration of World Day for Consecrated Life is transferred to the previous Sunday in order to highlight the gift of consecrated persons for the whole Church.

World Day for Consecrated Life will be celebrated in the Church on Monday, February 2, 2026, and in parishes this weekend: January 31, February 1, 2026. Please pray for all those who have made commitments in the consecrated life, and be sure to thank them on their special day. May they continue to be inspired by Jesus Christ and respond generously to God's gift of their vocation.

PERPETUAL ADORATION is a Eucharistic devotion whereby we unite in taking hours of adoration before the Most Blessed Sacrament both during the day and throughout the night, seven days a week. This is a great way to spend some time one-on-one with the Lord, encountering the Lord of all the universe who humbles himself and appears to us in our midst. Please help us fill every hour of every day. The blessings are abundant.

Please prayerfully consider spending an hour with Jesus in Adoration. At this time, we have an immediate need for an adorer at 8am on Sundays and 2am on Fridays.

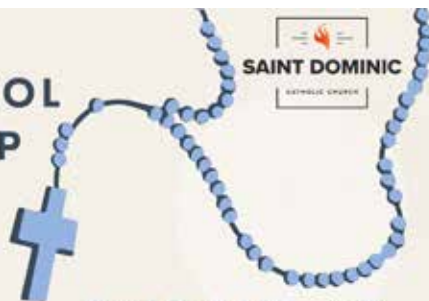

SAINT CARLO ACUTIS AND SAINT PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI WERE TWO YOUNG ITALIAN MEN CANONIZED ON SEPTEMBER 7, 2025 FOR THEIR VIBRANT AND JOYFUL WITNESS TO HOLINESS, EACH IN HIS OWN WAY.

Frassati (1901–1925) was a mountaineer who dedicated his wealth to serving the poor, while Acutis (1991–2006) was a computer prodigy who used his skills to evangelize online. Both were from wealthy families, experienced early deaths from illness, and lived models of youthful holiness, demonstrating that faith can be lived fully in the modern world.
