Growing Up

n the Christian life, spiritual growth is not guaranteed.

As his challenging parable of the sower conveys (Matthew 13, Mark 4, Luke 8), Jesus is realistic about this dynamic for those who would follow him.

Some never really get started with Jesus. The gospel seed falls along the beaten-down path where there is little chance of it being implanted. This is a mystery that often grieves us as we wonder why family members and beloved friends don't respond to Jesus.

Some have the illusion of growth. For a moment their faith shines brightly only to disappear as quickly as it emerged. Why? They were not deeply rooted in Jesus, the gospel seed having fallen on the rocky ground of their life. When troubles come, faith dissipates.

Some emerge with sincere faith. But the gospel seed has fallen among the thorns, the cares of the world and the lure of wealth and things, and ultimately such a faith is choked out.

Some manifest true and genuine faith. The gospel seed falls on good soil. These blessed people receive the Word of God and understand it (or stand under it!). This growing faith yields a harvest of varying dimensions.

Faith is a gift, as our Reformed theological heritage emphasizes. But tending to that gift is a choice. The Apostle Peter, who learned about spiritual growth in the school of his personal failures, says this: grow up! "Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18). The word used for grow is an imperative (a command!) and in the present tense, suggesting ongoing action. While we have breath in this life, we never graduate from the process of spiritual growth.

Growing up is the theme for Year 2 of our Journey to 75, the celebration of Hope Church's 75th anniversary in 2029. Using the image of a tree, we move from a focus on being deeply rooted in Jesus to the dynamic of growth happening above the soil.

This fall we will focus on biblical dynamics of growing up. We will learn from Jesus' experiences of growing up, as well as from those of Moses, Samuel, and David from the Old Testament, and Timothy from the New Testament.

These stories of growing up are complicated, as are our own stories. Often it is challenge that propels growth. Sometimes growth is helped by the gift of loving family.

Our intention and effort to grow spiritually matters. But, in the end, we can rest in this assurance, "God gives the growth!" (1 Corinthians 3:7). What a joy when our effort to be faithful is met by the goodness and grace of God, who always goes before us.

Loving and Merciful God, grow your people at Hope Church!

One of the fun things I did was read through old journals from high school and college. Some don't need to be read again—by anyone! But what I realized is that God made me ME and it was the same me back then, he's just been forming me and loving me all these years.

Carrots and Peppers and Onions, Oh My!

s we stand in the sunshine in the 70 degree (above zero!) Zimbabwe winter, we admire the rows of healthy, green vegetables in the large garden at Fountain of Life church. Maxwell gestures to the fence around us, made of tree branches left over from hand-clearing the land. We look around and see piles of long sticks and composting corn stalks left from last season's harvests near the garden squares in rows, which are carefully built up to resist flooding in the rainy season while holding in the topsoil and nutrients.

The planted 3-1/2-foot squares cradle the good topsoil amended with locally sourced manure and compost, nourishing the tomatoes, peppers, onions, carrots, and other vegetables as they grow.

Maxwell invites villagers to come here to teach them how to garden naturally, without using tractors, commercial insecticides, or chemical additives. Because it is literally "homegrown," expenses are minimal: only seeds and string to support the plants need to be purchased. His teaching textbook is Gardening God's Way by Grant Dryden.

He clearly loves his job, explaining that machinery strips away the topsoil, damaging the beneficial worms and termites that help aerate the soil. Gardening God's way is a doit-yourself project with your neighbors—the gardens supply food for families, and what is extra is available to share or to sell. There is only one more thing needed besides knowledge and sweat equity: water.

Our team of nine gathered for the first time in person in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe on May 23: Nick, Jen, Christian, and Ava Greener from Cape Town, South Africa; Peggy Turnbull, Heidi and Aaron Connors, and me from Hope Church, and Arben Hoti from Kosovo.

Arben and his wife, Blerina, are long-time friends of mine. My late husband John and I served on mission teams with the Hotis. Arben heads up Water for Life in Kosovo. I watched Nick and Arben connect over water projects, comparing methods, problem-solving. Just a couple of Christian guys from very different parts of the planet walking out their mutual call to bring the essentials of clean water and the Gospel to those who need it so much.

I am still in awe at how John's and my saying yes to God's invitation in 2000 to go serve in Kosovo is now bearing fruit 25 years later, far away on another continent. Gardens were not the only things growing on this trip. Our hearts did quite a bit of growing too!




