CELEBRATING OUR LOCAL MARTYR - ST EDMUND ARROWSMITH

On Sunday 24 August, a group of approximately 30 pilgrims set out from St Oswald and St Edmund Arrowsmith Church in Ashton to celebrate the life and witness of our local saint and to seek his intercession. Canon John Gorman blessed the pilgrims before they began their journey to Bryn where they then paused in prayer before the Lord at Our Lady's Church. From there, they continued to the Gerard School (once attended by the young Edmund Arrowsmith) crossing the fields until the group made their way back to St Oswald's Church.

Canon Sean Riley presided at Holy Mass and afterwards those gathered had the privilege of venerating the Holy Hand of St Edmund Arrowsmith. In his homily, Canon Riley reflected that the Hand is not merely a relic of the past, but a powerful reminder of St Edmund's service and sacrifice. It is also a sign of blessing and a missioning hand—sending us out to be living witnesses of faith today. St Edmund Arrowsmith, pray for us.
