**Invoices**

Over the next few days, you will receive an invoice from the archdiocese for the various services that you receive. Over the past few months, we have been reviewing our invoicing arrangements, and we have made some changes which we hope will be easier for you to understand and simplify the payment process.

The main change relates to the Voluntary Contribution which has been renamed as the **‘Education Department Service Charge’** and, for the first time, we are making clear to schools what this service provides. Please see the attached document [Education Department Service Charge](#).

Your invoice will now also include other services that apply to you such as the Primary or Secondary School Improvement Service, as well as any other services or subscriptions that you currently receive. Our hope is that you will find one invoice much easier to manage. Please note, however, that for VAT reasons, the Archdiocesan Levy will be covered on a separate invoice.

Our review of our financial arrangements with schools will continue next year. The Education Department Service Charge is based on a formula that has existed for at least 15 years, and we will be reviewing this for the next academic year. Please be assured that any increases to charges will be communicated to you well in advance.

### IDSR and ASP Analysis Training with Oliver McPhail

This is a full-day course for primary leaders to gain an in-depth understanding of the principles and purpose of assessment in schools before completing documentation that will support you in analysing and interpreting the updated Inspection Data Summary Report and ASP/SPS. A secure understanding of the strengths and weaknesses in the school's historic data will be addressed, ensuring you are inspection ready.

Outcomes:

- Understand the purpose and principles of assessment in the core subjects.
- Confirm what data is needed in schools to track pupil progress and why.
- Become familiar with highly effective assessment tools and methods.
- 'Get the job done' by analysing your own internal data on a template to identify actions and next steps.
- Understand how Ofsted uses the latest and previous external data sources (IDSR).
- 'Get the job done' by analysing your own IDSR onto a template.
- Identify areas of interest, strengths, and weaknesses.
- Be inspection ready by identifying key lines of enquiry.
- Be familiar with how to navigate and make the most of the 'Analyse School Performance' system.
- Interpret and analyse the school performance information in the DfE interactive online tool.
- Make evaluative judgments from the data to update your IDSR summary, school self-evaluation, and development plans; and
- Complete a school performance summary for your school using the materials provided.
