

Based on the results of its activities, the charitable foundation “Peaceful Heaven of Kharkiv” became one of the leaders of the Ukrainian charitable sector, ranking 16th in the national ranking “TOP 100+ Public Transparent Charitable Organizations of Ukraine” prepared by the Association of Ukrainian Philanthropists.

We consciously build a foundation in which transparency is not a formality. In 2024, the Foundation successfully passed an independent international audit by BDO. In 2025, it is undergoing a repeat international audit to confirm the compliance of our activities with high standards of financial management and corporate integrity.

All indicators in this report are not only statistics. These are concrete decisions, assistance, and changes that resulted from the joint work of the Foundation’s team and partners.

We sincerely thank everyone who supported “Peaceful Heaven of Kharkiv” in 2025. We continue to work openly, responsibly, and with a focus on results.

Obtaining accreditation from the Ukraine Humanitarian Fund (UHF) in 2025 was an important milestone in our organisation's institutional development. The assigned risk level reflects not only the complexity of the operational environment in which we work, but also our capacity to implement programmes in the most vulnerable and hard-to-reach communities.

The accreditation process involved a comprehensive review of our management, financial, programme, and data protection policies, which confirmed the Foundation's compliance with international standards of accountability, transparency and risk management.

For us, this recognition confirmed our readiness to effectively manage donor resources in complex humanitarian conditions and to ensure high-quality, timely, and responsible assistance to people who need it most.

CHILD PROTECTION



Child protection is one of the key priorities of our Foundation's activities, as children remain one of the most vulnerable groups in the context of a prolonged humanitarian crisis. Throughout 2025, the Foundation's team provided comprehensive support and protection for children, responding to their basic, psychological, and safety needs.

Within the **Child Protection** Cluster, we provided assistance to **13,726 children**, including the distribution of emergency child kits, which helped families cope with immediate challenges and create minimum conditions of safety and stability for children. These kits became an important component of rapid response to crisis situations and of supporting families in difficult life circumstances.

A dedicated focus of the work was directed toward psychosocial support for children. Throughout the year, **8 807 children and parents** participated in individual and group psychosocial support sessions. These activities helped children with traumatic experiences, and parents — to better understand their children's needs and support them in the recovery process.

The programme is aimed at supporting small and medium-sized businesses. The funding makes it possible to hire new employees, compensate costs related to salaries, taxes, and personal protective equipment, and also contributes to the development of entrepreneurship and the creation of jobs in communities..

Throughout the year, the Foundation implemented large-scale food assistance programmes. This year, one of the important achievements was the total number of loaves of bread distributed, which exceeded one million, an indicator of systematic, long-term support for the population.

In addition, within the framework of institutional and community catering, **22,400 hot meals** and **328,979 food packages** were provided, enabling support for the most vulnerable categories of the population in difficult life circumstances, totalling almost 1.5 million.

Employment and economic opportunity programmes aim to create new jobs, support local businesses, and enhance people's competitiveness in the labour market. As part of this focus area, job fairs, employment initiatives, and retraining programmes for vulnerable groups were organised.

Training sessions are an important component of community support, helping people adapt to difficult conditions and maintain resilience. Participants gain knowledge and practical skills in increasing crop yields, implementing modern technologies, animal care, and farm development, enabling them to survive more effectively and plan development even in crisis circumstances.

In parallel with emergency food assistance, the Foundation focused on the restoration and support of household livelihoods. In 2025, 840 agricultural kits were distributed, including greenhouses, motor cultivators, animal feed, and financial support in the form of microgrants was also provided for the development or restoration of agricultural activities. Overall, these measures made it possible to support thousands of people and contributed to the gradual restoration of the economic capacity of communities in various regions of Ukraine.

COMPLEX SUPPORT FOR WOMEN AND COMMUNITIES IN THE FIELD OF GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

The Foundation distributed dignity kits for women aged 13 to 66 years. In total, **71 dignity kits** were distributed, which made it possible to meet the needs of women and girls and to support their sense of safety and dignity in crisis conditions.

An important component of the work was prevention and awareness-raising. During 2025, the Foundation conducted lectures and information activities for **7,106 people** on the prevention of gender-based violence.

These activities were aimed at informing women and communities about GBV risks, available protection mechanisms, and options for accessing assistance. Increasing the level of awareness became an important tool for reducing vulnerability and strengthening the capacity of communities to respond to such challenges.





SHELTER





The main area of work in 2025 was the distribution of heating materials to populations in vulnerable situations. Throughout the year, the Foundation supported **3,402 households** by providing them with fuel materials for heating their homes.

The total volume of distributed resources amounted to **17,895 m³** of heating materials, which enabled households to better prepare for the winter period under heightened risks.

RECOVERY AND RECONSTRUCTION (PRESERVATION, EASY AND MEDIUM REPAIRS)

The recovery and reconstruction component is aimed at supporting households whose housing was damaged as a result of hostilities. The Foundation ensures the implementation of urgent repair works, including boarding up damaged windows, roof repairs, and housing conservation, which makes it possible for residents to safely remain in their homes and reduce the risks of further damage, allowing people to stay safely in their homes and reduce the risks of further destruction.

CASH FOR WINTERIZATION

During the winter period, our foundation implemented a **Cash for Winterization** assistance program to support vulnerable households in covering essential heating-related expenses.

Through this intervention, **1,267 households** received financial assistance that allowed them to prepare for and safely pass through the cold season.

Beneficiaries primarily used the funds to:
pay heating and utility bills, purchase solid fuel and heating materials,
cover other winter-related household needs.



Cash support in 2025 was an important component of the Foundation's programme activities and was aimed at meeting the basic needs of vulnerable population groups, including the payment of housing and utility services, provision of heating during the winter period, and the provision of emergency financial assistance in crisis and emergency situations in the context of the humanitarian crisis.

Special attention was given to children from vulnerable families and to communities with limited access to educational resources.

An important component of the work was the support of a safe and supportive learning environment. Through the combination of educational activities with elements of psychosocial support, the Foundation contributed not only to the assimilation of educational material, but also to the reduction of stress and anxiety levels among children. Educational activities also created space for communication, mutual support, and gradual adaptation to new conditions. The implementation of programmes in the field of education took place under conditions of constant change and challenges; however, thanks to a flexible approach and cooperation with communities, the Foundation ensured the continuity of support.

Health-related activities were launched in October 2025. During the reporting period, the geographic scope of this intervention covered Kharkiv, Dnipropetrovsk, and Mykolaiv oblasts. In Kharkiv and Dnipropetrovsk oblasts, mobile medical teams operate, composed of a psychologist, psychotherapist, family doctor, and gynecologist. These teams deliver services based at local outpatient clinics and feldsher-midwife points in frontline and conflict-affected communities, as well as in transit centers and surrounding frontline or hard-to-reach settlements, ensuring access to primary healthcare and psychosocial support for both local populations and internally displaced persons. In Mykolaiv oblast, health activities are implemented in cooperation with Primary Health Care Centers (PHCCs), where mental health and psychosocial support services are integrated into the routine operations of the primary healthcare system.



Throughout the reporting year, the Foundation actively developed its fundraising activities through cooperation with businesses, in particular with **restaurants** in Kharkiv. Within joint campaigns, 10% of the cost of selected dishes was allocated to charitable projects supporting children and veterans.

The Foundation also launched a series of events titled **"Charity QUIZ"** — an interactive format that allows people to spend time in an engaging way while simultaneously contributing to the support of charitable initiatives through donations. This became an effective tool for fundraising and increasing the visibility of the Foundation.




“LISTENING WITH THE HEART” PROJECT

During this festive season, every purchase at “**Chudo Market**” became a genuine expression of care for those who are just beginning their life journey. 1 UAH from each purchased bag was allocated to the project “Hear with the Heart” — a joint initiative of the Chudo Market supermarket chain and the Peaceful Heaven of Kharkiv Charitable Foundation.

Thanks to the funds raised, we will be able to purchase modern equipment for the intensive care unit of the Kharkiv City Perinatal Center. This equipment will help doctors detect even the smallest developmental abnormalities in newborns during the first days of their lives.

Together, we do more than just shopping — we give the youngest Ukrainians a chance for a healthy future.




CARE PACKAGE
