Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

Well, the icy winter weather has arrived in full force, with even a sprinkle of snow this week, just as we head into the last week of term. As next week is the final week of Term 2, students will be finishing at 2.30pm next Friday the 4th of July. The final assembly will begin in the Big Shed at 1.45pm led by our student leaders. Term 3 commences on Monday the 21st of July, with our Grade 4s and 5s heading off to their 3-day camp at Queenscliff.

This afternoon student reports will be sent home with students. They give parents/carers an outline of the learning that has taken place in the first half of the year and how students are progressing in line with the Victorian Curriculum. There may be some learning areas that are not reported on in this report which will be reported on in the end of year reports. This year, student reporting for mathematics in Victorian government schools has changed. The Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA) recently published its revised mathematics curriculum (Mathematics curriculum 2.0).

All Victorian government schools will start using the Mathematics curriculum 2.0 in 2024 or 2025. At Tylden Primary School we are using the revised mathematics curriculum for school reporting from Semester 1 2025.

On your child's previous report, the teacher reported against the 3 strands of the achievement standard for mathematics (Number and Algebra,

Measurement and Geometry, and Statistics and Probability). Under the Mathematics curriculum 2.0, your child's teacher will report against the achievement standard as a whole, providing a single, aggregated score.

As the achievement standards reported on have changed, the first time you receive a report under the Mathematics 2.0 curriculum, it will only show achievement and not progress. For all reports after this, progress will be shown against the single achievement standard.

Please remember to book a parent / teacher interview, if you would like to arrange a time to speak with your child's teacher. Interview slips were in last week's newsletter. The interview times are for Wednesday the 2nd and Thursday the 3rd of July. If you cannot attend these times, please contact your child's classroom teacher to organise an alternative time.

Finally, just a quick reminder to ensure your child/ren have a spare change of clothes in their school bag. As the weather becomes wetter the school's stocks of spare clothes for students who get muddy or wet are very limited. We try our best to allow students as much outdoor play time as the weather permits and accidents do happen. Thank you for your assistance.
