

It was a 3-course meal today. We started with Sweetcorn soup. We adjusted the recipe to add some of our fantastic cabbage from the school garden. Next was Twice Baked Potatoes, these were a big favourite and there wasn't a scrape of them left. We finished our meal with a Lemon Yoghurt Cake for dessert. No one left the kitchen hungry!!

The grade 3's were busy in the garden. They built a garden bed on Hugelkultar, a traditional European no dig style of gardening. Also plenty weeding and planting strawberries around the fruit trees was done.











BOLOBEK FUNDRAISER

Tylden Primary will be selling slices of passionfruit sponge cake at the Bolobek Garden Fair on Saturday 4th & Sunday 5th October. Last year, the school sold pork rolls and it was very successful.

The passionfruit sponge has developed quite the reputation and people attend the fair year after year to buy a slice! I would love some help baking the sponge cakes and have included the recipe below. We are aiming to make 80 cakes! Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any questions about the recipe. I will also need some help assembling cakes on Friday afternoon before the fair (3rd October) and on the Saturday and Sunday. If you are interested in helping assemble sponge cakes in the kitchen at Bolobek or work on the stall, I'd love to hear from you! Fresh sponge cake, lemon curd, cream, passionfruit icing....

Sponge Recipe:

4 eggs (approx 240gm)

3/4 cup sugar

1 teaspoon Cream of Tartar

1/2 teaspoon Bicarb Soda

1 cup Wheaten Cornflour

1 teaspoon vanilla

Method:

- 1. Beat eggs well in electric mixer, approximately 8 minutes.
- 2. Add sugar in three lots, beating for a total of another 2 minutes. Add the vanilla.
- 3. Sift dry ingredients into a bowl twice.
- 4. Sift dry ingredients onto the top of the egg mixture and fold in gently with a spatula or big

spoon. There will be some lumps, keep gently folding. Be careful not to over mix.

5. Spray two cake tins with oil and cut a circle of baking paper for the bottom. You will need two

2x8 inch tins.

- 6. Bake in a fan forced oven for 20 mins at 160 degrees.
- 7. Use a knife to run around the edge of the cake tin, turn cake out and cool. Please leave baking $\,$

paper on the bottom of the cake.

8. Once cool, please put in a freezer bag or zip lock bag. Freeze immediately (be careful not to

stack anything on top!) or bring to school and Lisa will collect and put in her deep freeze.

**Very important!

Please do not use regular cornflour, it is gluten free and your cake will not rise! I use

Fielders Wheaten Cornflour available from the IGA in Woodend.


