The cost per students is \$40 for entry and travel and the fair funds cover the lessons.

Could you please complete the assessment form and return it to the office by **Friday**, **31st October**. This will help the aquatic centre determine the appropriate group and lesson for your child.

Requirements for lessons: bathers, a swimming cap, goggles (if required) and a towel in a waterproof reusable bag. Please ensure all belongings and towel are NAMED. If the children can take it off, please name it!

SWIMMING CAPS ARE COMPULSORY and if your child does not already have a cap, they can be purchased at the Kyneton Aquatic Centre or sports stores etc.

HEADLICE / NITS

We have had a head lice infection reported to the school this week. If your child seems to be scratching his/her head or complaining about feeling itchy, then a thorough check is warranted!

Please check your children's hair carefully and treat them if necessary. Head lice are spread easily, so it is important to act immediately they are discovered. Remember that a second treatment after 7 days is essential.

Head lice are annoying, but their spread can be minimised if every family is vigilant about checking for them and thorough when treating an infection.

It is important to make sure long hair is tied back off their face as this helps minimise the spread.

It is important to advise the school if headlice are detected. Thank you for your cooperation with this matter.



3M's Aussie Bird Count

Bird watching




This week, our students have been taking part in the Aussie Bird Count, a nationwide citizen science project that helps BirdLife Australia track local bird populations.

During our daily sessions, students are learning how to identify different bird species, observe their behaviours, and record data through structured surveys. Armed with tally sheets and binoculars, our young ornithologists' have been exploring the school grounds and surrounding bushland in pairs, noting the variety and number of birds they spot whilst also taking note of the birds behaviour. Each afternoon, students have been collecting and analysing bird count data using their mathematical skills.

Together, they discuss what their data shows before interpreting and creating graphs, both by hand and digitally. This process of tallying results, representing data, and identifying trends has been a hands on way to combine science, maths, and environmental learning, while building curiosity and appreciation for the natural world around Tylden.

We noticed when you actually try to quietly bird watch, you discover birds you have never seen before when you're playing outside. Collecting real life data made us feel excited and now lots of us have a new interest for birds!




