WELLBEING FOR LEARNING



Pivot Wellbeing for Learning



This term at Tylden Primary School students in grades 1-6 began using an evidencebased survey program produced by Pivot called Wellbeing for Learning. The program is used to monitor and support student mental and emotional health through short weekly surveys which measure general wellbeing, safety, resilience, and belonging at both school and home. The data collected enables us to measure, track and support students by identifying areas of focus in student wellbeing. Students are also able to request individual support through the survey. Pivot surveys operate in 5-week cycles with the next cycle to begin in Term 1, 2026.


Tylden CFA Santa Run 2025 Sunday 21st December from 10am
