GENERAL INFORMATION

UPDATING RECORDS

It is important that all details we hold for your child at the school are current and correct. If you have updated your mobile number, email address or postal address, changed employment or employee please advise the office by email or phone. Changes can be done on XUNO or by emailing the school. tylden.ps@education.vic.gov.au

STUDENT ABSENCE NOTES REQUIRED

If your child is absent from school at any time you are required to notify the school. The preferred method is via XUNO or by email. Please give the reason for the absence. It is a legal requirement that the school receives an explanation for all student absences. The school will contact you if your child is absent and you have not provided an explanation.

If you are away for a period of time (EG: Family holiday) Please email your class teacher and the school tylden.ps@education.vic.gov.au.

PERSONAL GOODS BEING BROUGHT TO SCHOOL

Personal Items/property is often brought to school by students, staff and visitors. This can include mobile phones, electronic games, calculators, toys, musical instruments, sporting equipment, and cars parked on school premises. The DET does not hold insurance for personal property brought to school and it has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property.

VISITORS' BOOK AT OFFICE COUNTER

As part of our emergency procedures, we have a Visitors' Book at the office counter. Visitors who are staying at school for any reason must sign in at the office so there is a record of who is on the premises in case of emergency. This includes parent helpers who might be assisting with classroom programs.

ZETLAND LODGE

DRINK BOTTLES & HATS

Drink bottle- It is important that students bring a drink bottle to school each day. Having water bottles in the classroom will keep the kids hydrated, and reduce the time they ask to go and get a drink from the drink troughs. Please ensure that the drink bottle is clearly labelled.

Hats- ensure students have a wide brim hat each day at school, that is clearly labelled. Students can leave their hats at school.

XUNO APP

The XUNO app is a very important information channel used by the school. It is free to download, and you can receive notifications on your phone or via email. Contact the office for assistance if you are having any difficulties connecting to XUNO.

CS&E FUND

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) will provide payments for eligible students to attend camps, sports and excursions. Families holding a valid means-tested concession card are eligible to apply. Payments are made directly to the school and are tied to the student.

CSEF applications open from Term 1, 2026. Forms are available at the office. Parents or legal guardians are required to submit a new CSEF application form each year.

THE SCHOOL CROSSING

Please be patient when parking and leaving from car parks.

Help to maintain the schools good relationship with our neighbours, by **always keeping clear of their driveways.**

Always load and unload children from the 'footpath side' of the car. Do not park in the bus zones.

Move slowly and be vigilant when driving, reversing and parking in the Clayton Street car park. Keep the disabled parking spaces free for those who need them and are displaying the required sticker.

Please take care to park at the legal distance from the crossing, so children can be seen clearly. **There must be no exceptions to this, as accidents can occur in seconds. Never drop off or pick up too close to the crossing.**

The rules are as follows:

When a children's crossing is in operation (ie. when the flags are displayed), you must not stop:

- *on the school crossing*
- *within 20 metres of the crossing on the approach side*
- *within 20 metres of the crossing on the departure side*

You are not permitted to do a U-turn over the solid lines beside the crossing.

ARRIVAL TIME AT SCHOOL

The ideal time for children to arrive at school is around 8:50 am. This gives them time to unpack their school bag and get organised for the day, connect with some friends and have a short play before the bell at 9am.

Yard supervision at school starts at 8:40am. **To ensure their safety, students should not enter the school grounds before the gates open at 8:40am.** Students should not be dropped off and left unsupervised outside the school gates before 8:40am.

Please enquire at the office about the Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) service that runs daily before and after school. Before School Care operates from 6:30am—8:40am for parents who need to drop off children before 8:40am. We also run a "short session" 8am—8:40am at a reduced cost to help if you need to get to work by 9am but don't need to drop off very early. Book at the office on the day prior to needing the service. Children receive breakfast and supervised activities before being taken to their classrooms at 8:40am.

END OF SCHOOL DAY

School finishes each day at 3:30pm. Please make sure your child knows who will collect them from school and where they will meet them. If you are delayed unexpectedly but will arrive shortly after the bell, you can ring the school and we will let your child know so they do not worry. The child can then wait with the yard duty teacher. For longer delays, the child can be booked into After School Care until you arrive.

Children who remain at school after the last bus leaves will be booked into After School Care by the staff member on bus duty to ensure their safety until you arrive.

BIKE & SCOOTER SAFETY

Please advise all children riding bikes and scooters to and from school they are to leave from the Clowes Street main gate near the school crossing. They should not leave through the gate that leads to the Clayton Street car park.

Children should cross Clowes Street at the crossing if they need to proceed to the south side of the road.

Those who stay on the north side of Clowes Street to go home, should cross Clayton Street at the corner where they are clearly visible to drivers.

For everyone's safety all children must dismount and wheel their bikes and scooters in the school grounds and on the paths beside the school.

LATE ARRIVAL AND EARLY DEPARTURE

Punctual attendance at school every day is extremely important. Late arrivals can be unsettling for children and also interfere with their learning. A late arrival means the child misses making social connections with their friends before the bell, and misses part or all of their first learning activity for the day. Aim for arrival at school at 8:50am each day to give your child time to settle in before the bell.

Our emergency management procedures require the following:

- **LATE ARRIVAL**-Parent/Carer are to accompany the student/s to the office to sign students in if they are late to school. The students then receive a late pass to take to their classroom.
- **EARLY DEPARTURE**-Always come to the office to sign students out for an early departure. Office staff will collect the children from the classrooms if they need to leave early.
- **FORGOTTEN ITEMS** -If your child has forgotten something and you bring it to school after the bell, please take it to the office. The object will be delivered to your child by staff.

SCHOOL PROCEDURES FOR THE BUSHFIRE SEASON

HOT WEATHER

The school is open even in very hot weather. There is no Education Department policy for closure once a certain temperature is reached. However, on days of extreme heat, our school enacts its Inclement Weather Policy and will shorten all outside time in recess and lunch breaks to help keep the children cool and comfortable.



BUSHFIRE INFORMATION

Each year, to prepare for bushfires and grassfires, schools and early childhood services complete a range of activities. The Department of Education runs an annual fire risk assessment of schools and early childhood services. They are allocated a category of risk (categories 0 to 4) and are published on the Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR). All schools and early childhood services listed on the BARR and Category 4 list will close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district. As part of preparing our school for the fire season, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan and completed works that will prepare our school site for the threat of fire.

When the Bureau of Meteorology provides public fire danger rating forecasts or fire weather warnings, they use fire weather district areas. In Victoria, there are 9 fire weather districts, which are based on Local Government Area boundaries. Our school is in the **Central** fire weather district.

What is the department's policy?

The department's [Bushfire and Grassfire Preparedness Policy](#) requires all schools and early childhood services on the BARR and the Category 4 list to close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district. All school bus routes which travel in or through a district with Catastrophic fire danger must also be cancelled.

Our school has been identified as being at risk of bushfire or grassfire and is a Category 3 school on the BARR. This means that our school will close on a day forecasted as Catastrophic fire danger rating in the Central fire district.

Closure of the school due to a forecast Catastrophic day will be confirmed on the day prior and we will provide you with this advice before the end of the school day. Any information regarding potential or confirmed Catastrophic fire danger days will be communicated to you by the XUNO app.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, even if the weather forecast changes. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to be aware that: **no one** will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Catastrophic day.

- Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days.
- All bus routes that travel through the Catastrophic area will be cancelled.

School camps and excursions will be cancelled if a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast for fire weather district in which the camp is located, or if the travel involves passing through areas that have Catastrophic fire danger.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Catastrophic days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Catastrophic day.

FAMILY BUSHFIRE SURVIVAL PLANS

Families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan on Catastrophic fire danger rating days and on other days of extreme heat or high fire danger. **On such days, children should never be left at home alone or in the care of older children.**

What can families and the school community do to help us prepare?

- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers.
- Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters, checking the XUNO app, by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff about our emergency management plan.
- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed due to a Catastrophic fire danger. Further information can be found on the [CFA's website](#).
- You are advised to enact your family's bushfire survival plan if your own triggers are met. Our school community may be spread out across many areas and some families may be at higher risk than others. Your family's safety is critical, so please let us know if you are enacting your bushfire survival plan and if your children will be absent on these days.
- If your child is old enough, talk to [them about bushfires](#) and your family's bushfire survival plan.




