Principal's Message

Dear parents and carers,

It has been another great week at Tylden Primary School. We had our first Fire Drill on Wednesday morning, where we evacuated to the oval. I was very impressed with the calmness, orderly manner and quick response from all staff, students and visitors. Well done everyone! We will have another drill later this term, when we have all of our prep students attending full time.

You may have noticed that we have had some gutter works completed on Clowes Street this week. I am pleased to say that the Macedon Ranges Shire Council has done a great job in making these areas safe for all our students and families. Please remember to use the school crossing when crossing at Clowes Street during drop off and pick up times.

The process of electing the student leadership team has almost been completed this week. At Tylden Primary School, this formal leadership team is decided through a series of elections. All students in grades 3—6 and all staff are eligible to vote in these elections. The election for School Captains and Vice Captains was held late last year. The election process continued this year to select our House Captains, Wellbeing Leaders and JSC Presidents. Each candidate gave a short speech to the students in grades 3—6 and then students and staff voted in a secret ballot.




