CSEF

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) will provide payments for eligible students to attend camps, sports and excursions. Families holding a valid means-tested concession card are eligible to apply. Payments are made directly to the school and are tied to the student.

CSEF applications open from Term 1, 2026. Forms are available at the office. Parents or legal guardians are required to submit a new CSEF application form each year.

SCHOOL CROSSING

Please ensure that you park the required legal distance from the school crossing. *Do not park inside the "No Standing" zones even for a minute.*

The "No Standing" zone provides clear vision of the crossing for all drivers so they can see and stop when a child is trying to cross. An accident can occur in an instant, so please do not obstruct the clear view of the crossing at any time when the Children Crossing flags are displayed.

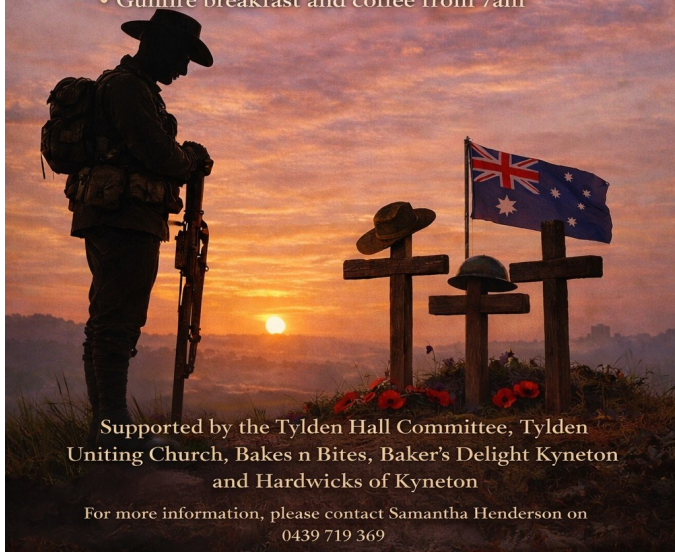
