What Happened??

🎵 MOSHE SINGS HIS FINAL SONG

Moshe is almost finished speaking to Bnei Yisrael. But instead of giving another regular speech, he teaches them a song! The song will help Bnei Yisrael remember Hashem and the lessons Moshe taught them, even after Moshe is gone.



TORAH IS LIKE RAIN

Moshe says his Torah teachings should fall like rain and dew on the grass. Just like rain helps tiny plants grow, Torah helps us grow!



HASHEM IS OUR ROCK

Again and again, Moshe calls Hashem a Rock. A giant rock is strong, steady, and doesn't disappear when things get stormy. Moshe wants Bnei Yisrael to remember that Hashem is always there for them.



LIKE AN EAGLE PROTECTING ITS BABIES

Moshe gives an amazing picture of Hashem caring for Bnei Yisrael: like an eagle watching over its baby chicks, spreading its wings and carrying them safely. Hashem has protected Bnei Yisrael throughout their journey.



DON'T FORGET HASHEM!

Moshe warns that when Bnei Yisrael arrive in Eretz Yisrael and have delicious food, beautiful homes, and comfortable lives, they might forget Who gave them everything. Having lots of good things should make us more thankful, not less!



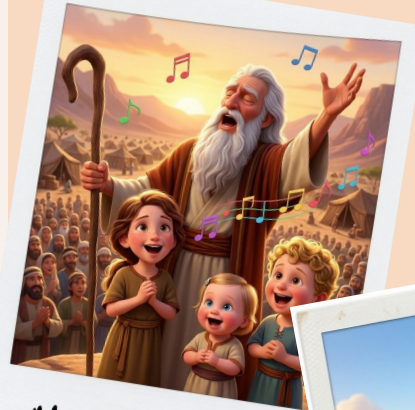
MOSHE SEES ERETZ YISRAEL

At the very end, Hashem tells Moshe to climb Har Nevo. From there, Moshe will get to look out over the beautiful land that Bnei Yisrael are about to enter. Moshe won't enter it himself, but after everything he has done, he gets to see the Promised Land with his own eyes.

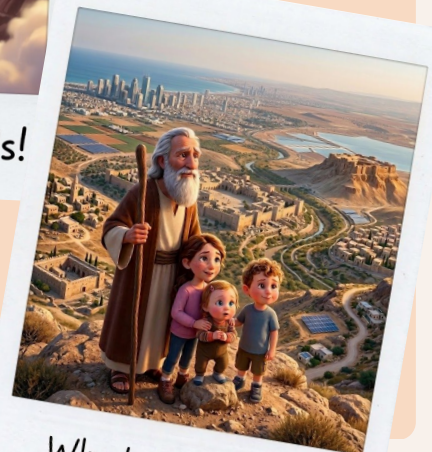
