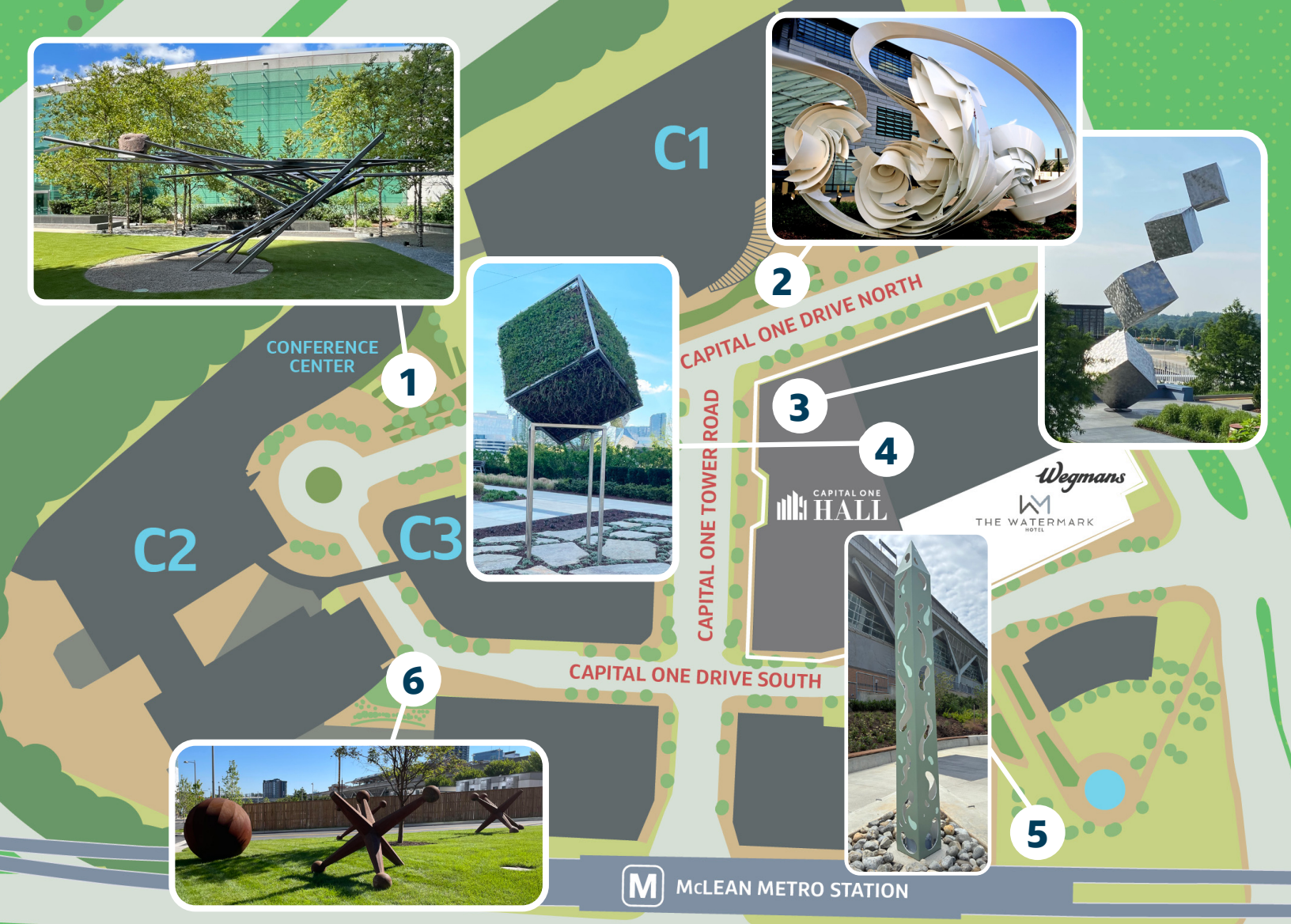
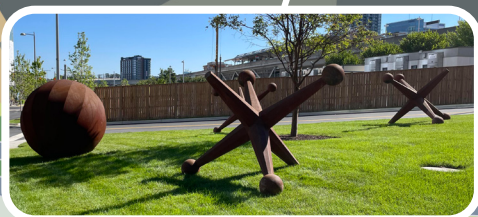
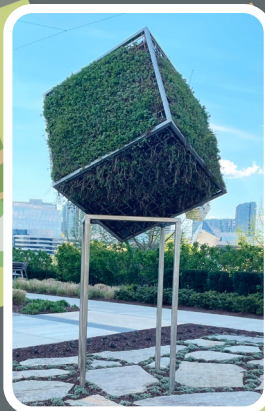




1 DEL GEIST

Cracked Ice Balance (2025)

Cracked Ice Balance by Del Geist is a series of stainless steel rods seemingly heaped together that support a precariously placed stone boulder. The work metaphorically addresses human-accelerated climate change, environmental instability and 18,000 years of ecological history through the lens of the erratic boulder.

2 ALICE AYCOCK

Hoop-La (2016-2018)

Made with a computer-aided design (CAD) program, Alice Aycock's *Hoop-La* is a dynamic visualization of natural energy and conceptual ideas represented by a series of spiral vortexes gathering momentum, referencing wind and weather patterns as well as the unpredictable ways that ideas connect.

3 PHILIP STEWART

32 Corners (2022)

32 Corners by Philip Stewart is an interactive, 27-foot sculpture consisting of four stainless steel cubes that float effortlessly based on internal mechanics that were custom engineered for the piece to allow a full rotation of 360 degrees.

4 PATRICIA LEIGHTON

Echo Green (2021)

Echo Green by Patricia Leighton features a variety of living sedum and succulent plants that change with the season and highlight the interdependence between nature and culture.

5 MICKAEL BROTH

For Which It Stands, 2026

Mickael Broth's *For Which It Stands* (2026) reinterprets the ancient obelisk form to examine universal symbols and understand their continued relevance today.

6 DAVID TANYCH

The Big Game (2022)

David Tanych's *The Big Game* (2022) is an oversized interpretation of the game of jacks, made in patinated steel and inspired by Tanych's childhood memories.
