Since 2022, both the ACO World Super Senior (65+) and the ACO World Amateur Chess Championship have been held on Kos with great success. We were therefore especially keen to continue this wonderful tradition in 2027.

The ACO World Amateur Chess Championship 2027 will take place as an open tournament from May 6–15, 2027, on the Greek island of Kos. Any player with a rating below 2400 can represent his or her country and become the ACO World Amateur Champion 2027!

Venue:

5* Atlantica Belvedere Resort on Kos. The hotel was originally known as Helona Resort and was the venue of the ACO events in 2015–2018 and 2022–26. The playing hall is located inside the hotel, and lifts are available. ACO will arrange the accommodation for all participants at the hotel.

The hotel is an adults-only hotel, which means that only participants aged 16 and above can attend the chess tournament.

Players and accompanying persons under the age of 16 can also stay at the sister hotel, the 5-star Hotel Atlantica Beach Resort, just a few hundred metres away. More information on this can be found on pages 26+27.

All players and accompanying persons are required to stay in the official hotels. All booking must be made directly through the ACO.

Tournament committee:

GM Falko Bindrich, IM Tobias Hirneise and FIDE arbiter Peter Frei.
Decisions of the committee are final.

Mode and time control:

9 rounds, Swiss-System / 90 minutes for 40 moves + 15 min. with an increment of 30 seconds per move starting from move 1.
Default time: 30 minutes.

Tiebreaks in case of a tie:

1. Buchholz score (number of points of your opponents added)
2. progress score (adding up your points after each round)
3. Direct encounter

If there are fewer than 11 players per group, a round-robin tournament (everyone against everyone) may also be played. In case of a tie the Sonneborn-Berger scoring system is used. For this you receive all the points of the opponents against whom you have won and half the points for draws. If this tiebreak is also equal, the direct encounter decides.

New rating groups without effect! (Starting from 2025)

Our tournament is traditionally played in 7 separate rating groups. This means that you only play against opponents of a similar level. The rating at the time of registration applies. For players with an international rating (Elo) and a national rating, the higher number applies.

Adjustment of rating groups necessary due to FIDE Elo bonus

As of 1 March 2024, FIDE has given all players with an Elo below 2000 an Elo bonus. The Elo minimum for players receiving their first Elo has also been set at 1400. For this reason, we have to adjust the rating groups C to G accordingly (see also next page).

How is the Elo bonus calculated?

Difference of 2000 minus your old Elo (from Feb. 2024) times 0.4.

Example for a player with an Elo rating of 1700:

2000 minus 1700 = 300 difference. $300 \times 0.4 = 120$ points bonus.

The new Elo is 1820 (1700 + 120 points)

This means that a player who previously played in Group D (1601 - 1800) remains in the same Group D (1751 - 1900).

Players with Elo

For players who only have a national rating and no Elo, the before-mentioned formula is used for grouping. Example: if a player has a national rating of 1700 and no Elo, he will be assigned to Group D with a virtual rating of 1820 (see calculation on the left). This means that the same standards apply to all players.

Note for players in Group G

Although the G group now extends up to a rating of 1500 instead of 1200 as before, the playing strength of the opponents does not change. No players from the former F group (1201-1400) can play in the new G group (0-1500), as these players now have a rating of 1501+ due to the rating adjustments and therefore play in the new Group F.

Players without rating:

Players who do not have a national or international number can only participate in Group G.

Playing in another group (voluntary):

Possible if a rating corresponding to that of another group is achieved between the time of registration and the start of the tournament.

The tournament organisers reserve the right to change the grouping of individual players in exceptional cases. Similarly, two groups may be merged if the number of participants is low. In this case, however, the final ranking and prize money distribution will take place separately.

The venue

The 5* Atlantica Belvedere Resort Kos (formerly Helona Resort) was built by the Hilton Group and has 21 pools. The hotel is an adults-only hotel, which means that only participants aged 16+ can take part in the tournament. The hotel has already hosted several ACO events in the years 2015–18 and 2022–2026.

Playing halls

There are two playing halls, both with carpet and lots of space for the players. During the games, all players (and their accompanying persons) can enjoy free coffee, water, tea, soft drinks, fruits, cake, and cookies.

The organizers

GM Falko Bindrich and IM Tobias Hirneise have been responsible for the organisation of all ACO tournaments since 2012. They are personally on site at all events and are happy to answer any questions you may have.



GM Falko Bindrich (Germany)

learned chess at the age of six from his older brother and was coached by his father Oswald Bindrich at the beginning of his career. He was German Champion U12, U14, U16 and European Champion U18 with the German youth national team. At 12, he was the youngest German ever to win the FM title. At 16, he became Germany's youngest grandmaster at the time, after which he became an honorary citizen of his hometown of Zittau. He took part in the 2008 and 2010 Chess Olympiads as a member of the German national team and trained with former world champion Anatoli Karpov in preparation. During his career Bindrich took part in more than 20 European and World Youth Championships, in which he drew against Magnus Carlsen and won against World Championship challenger Ian Nepomniachtchi, among others. In 2008 he won the largest German Open in Deizisau with more than 700 participants. In 2003, 2005, 2007 and 2009 Bindrich was voted „Player of the Year“ by the German Chess Youth, making him one of the players with the most awards. Bindrich played for years in the Swiss Team Championship for SG Luzern and with his Austrian team SK Hohenems and with his Belgian team Cercle d'Échecs Fontainois he became Austrian and Belgian team champion respectively. In 2017 Bindrich won the German Masters ahead of the best German players. His highest elo rating is 2610. In addition to chess, Bindrich completed a master's degree in psychology and works as a psychologist.

IM Tobias Hirneise (Germany)

comes from Stuttgart (Germany), learned chess from his grandfather and played his first chess tournament at the age of 11. After several state championship titles in the youth field, he became the Men's State Champion of Baden in 2008. Since 2009 Hirneise has held the title of International Chess Champion (IM) and played for many years in the German Chess Bundesliga for the team of SV Wattenscheid. His highest rating is 2481. In 2016, he achieved his first grandmaster norm. He was trained by the coaches IM Valeri Bronznik from Ukraine, GM and ACO coach Zigurds Lanka from Latvia, GM Boris Avrukh from Israel and GM Ognjen Cvitan from Croatia. In Switzerland he played for the clubs Reti Zurich and Herrliberg, in Austria first for the chess club Vöcklabruck and later in the Bundesliga for SK Götzis. As a trainer, he worked mainly with talented children from southern Germany. Several of his students achieved medal places in German championships and qualified for youth world championships. As a player and trainer, Hirneise took part in chess tournaments in more than 30 countries. He is a publishing merchant, graphic designer and former editor-in-chief of the German chess magazine Rochade Europa. Since 2018 he has been the publisher of the children's chess magazine Rochade Kids, which is used by more than 50 000 children. The magazines have been translated into Swedish, Norwegian and English language.



Get to know (y)our chess trainers on site

Zigurds Lanka from Latvia (left) is considered one of the best-known chess coaches in the world. Lanka is a multiple Latvian master and the author of several chess books. He is known above all for his extraordinarily broad opening knowledge, which he understands better than anyone else how to make accessible to amateur players. For Latvia, Lanka took part in three Chess Olympiads and several European and World Team Championships. His best-known students include the grandmasters Alexei Shirov, Viktor Bologan and Falko Bindrich.

Daniel King from England (middle) became a Grandmaster in 1989. Highlights of his career are winning the 1992 Goodricke Open tournament in Calcutta, India, defeating Vishy Anand along the way and representing his country on numerous occasions including the famous victory by England over the Soviet Union in Reykjavik 1990. After his professional playing career, he went into the media appearing on TV and online as a chess commentator and presenter. He has worked all over the world for channels such as the BBC, Channel 4 (UK), ESPN (USA), and Eurosport; and for websites such as chess.com, playchess.com, the ICC, and Chess24.

Spyridon Skembris from Greece (right) finished third in the World Junior Championship in 1977. In the following years he won the Greek championship four times and in 1990 he was awarded the grandmaster title. Skembris is one of the most respected team coaches. He is the former national coach of Greece and also coached the national team of Cyprus. Skembris represented Greece in a total of eight Chess Olympiads. In 1992 he won the gold medal on the second board at the European Team Championship in Debrecen.

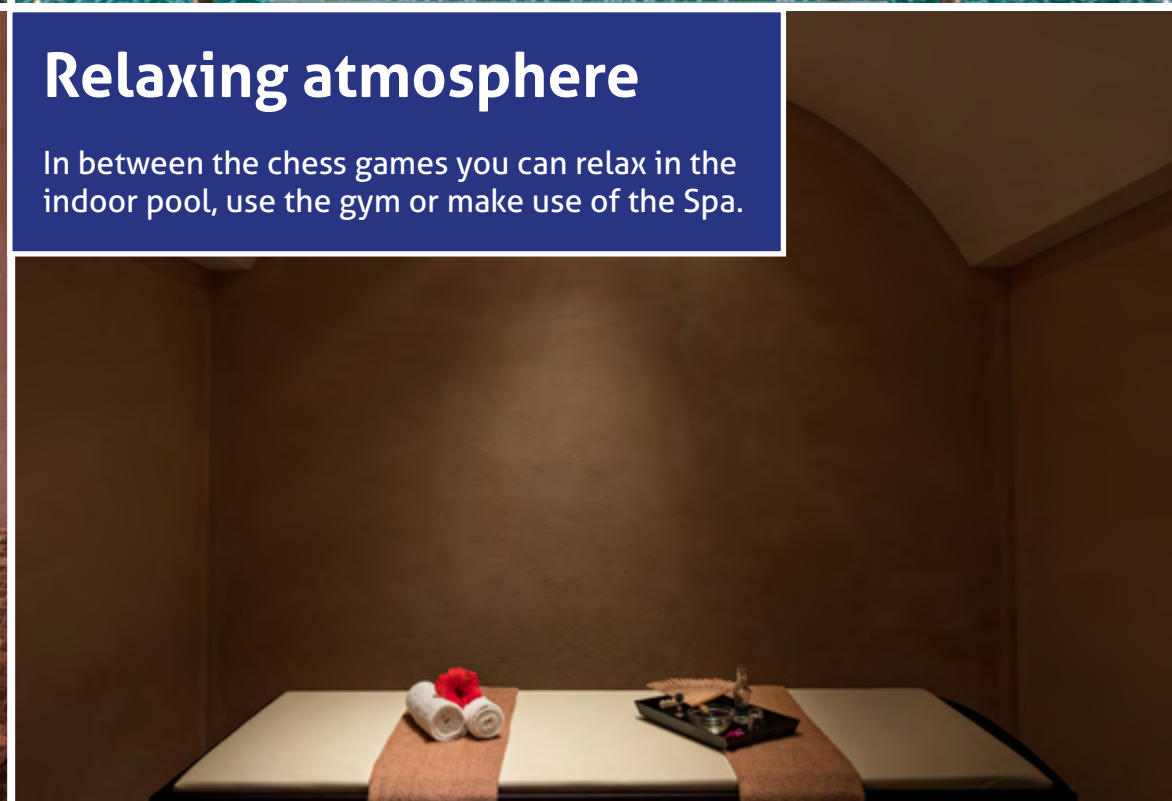
From the private sandy beach you have a magnificent view to the island of Nyssiros.

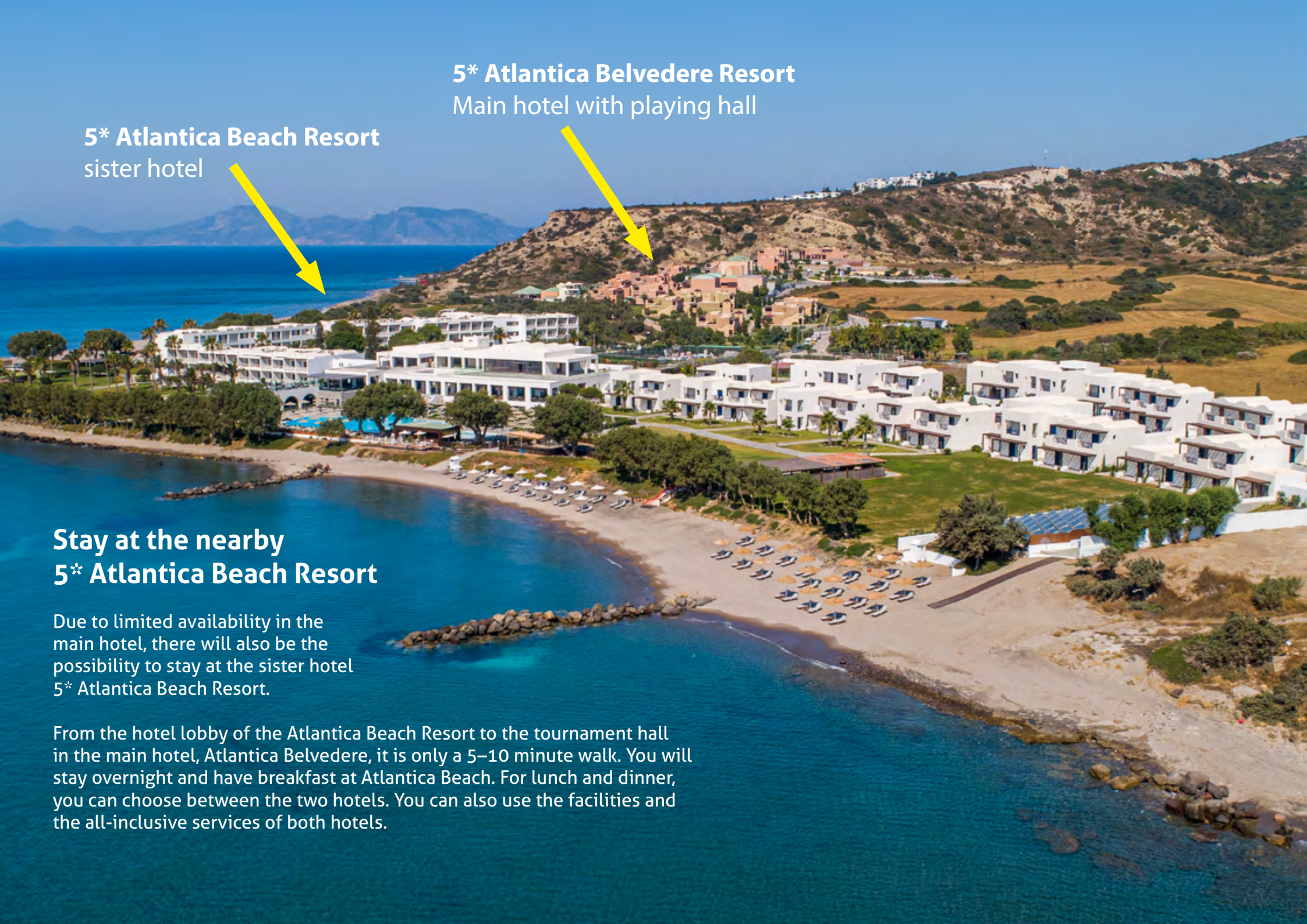

Special guest 2025: IM Eric Rosen

The well-known chess streamer, YouTuber and International Chess Master from the United States was part of the coaching team on site in Kos in 2025. He is one of the most successful chess streamers in the world with over 1 million followers. He analysed games with the participants, gave seminars and a simultaneous and played in the blitz tournaments.



No or hardly any tournament chess experience? No problem - play in our group G!

The G Group is designed for chess players with a rating below 1500 or no official Elo rating at all. Many participants in this group are playing in their very first tournament—often filled with curiosity, and sometimes a little nervousness. That's exactly what the group is for: a welcoming, supportive environment for those who love chess but have little or no experience.

A particularly lovely aspect is that partners of more experienced players—who are competing in the higher groups—often decide to take part themselves. What begins as a simple accompanying trip frequently turns into a shared tournament experience. The relaxed and open atmosphere of the G Group invites newcomers to give it a try, even if they've never played in an official event before. You will only compete against other participants with similar playing strength.

This ensures balanced, fair games without pressure—perfect for anyone taking their first steps in tournament chess. And if questions arise—about the clock, notation, or procedures—the organizing team and the tournament arbiter are always ready to help with patience and understanding. Support is always available, and every question is welcome.

At the heart of it all is the joy of playing, the courage to try something new, and the shared experience across the chessboard. The event is accompanied by a carefully designed program featuring grandmaster lectures, simultaneous exhibitions, and many opportunities to connect with fellow chess enthusiasts from around the world. The G Group offers much more than just a tournament—it creates a warm, inclusive community and the ideal setting for an unforgettable introduction to the world of tournament chess.

Free day – time to explore Kos island

Our free day offers you enough time to explore the lovely island of Kos. Visit the most interesting attractions of the island and enjoy the typical Greek flair in Kos town. You have the possibility to join a guided bus tour including a tourist guide or to discover the island on your own.

Asklepion

Besides the capital Kos with its many alleys and influences of different religions, the beautiful beaches of the island, the mountain village of Zia and the knight's castle of the Order of St. John, the ruin of Asklepion is a must for all lovers of Greek history. Founded by the father of western medicine, Hippocrates, it was one of the first sanatoriums where the sick were treated.



Chess, chess, chess! Our side programme

Blitz chess:

One of the many highlights of ACO Championships include our blitz tournaments with five minutes per player. Our Welcome Blitz tournament always takes place in the evening after the first round. There is always a good atmosphere and it is very easy to make contacts. All participants play together in a single group.

Team blitz:

Equally popular is our Team Blitz tournament, where teams of 2 (on two boards) compete against each other. You may choose your partner, everybody is involved, from beginner to grandmaster!

Simultaneous exhibition:

There is always a big crowd at the simultaneous exhibition, too. Over 80 players competed against our team of title holders in 2019.



Break guaranteed! The bye rule

In our tournaments we play 2 double rounds. As this can be very exhausting, we offer all participants the chance to take 1 or 2 'rest breaks'. **This is totally voluntary!** These rest breaks are called 'bys' in chess language. A bye is when you sit out a round but receive half a point in return. This allows you to rest and still not slip down the table. Afterwards, you can play in the tournament again as normal.

You can take up to 2 byes in rounds 1–6. Bys are not possible in a round-robin tournament (everyone plays against everyone) or if a group has a low number of participants and this would cause problems with the pairings.

A 'bye' is also included in your Buchholz rating (the second tiebreak in the event of a tie, where the points of all opponents are added together). According to the current FIDE rules (as of 2025), for an unplayed or forfeit game, your own score is used as the Buchholz score. **Example:** You take a bye in round 3 and have scored 5 points in the final standings. Your Buchholz score for round 3 is 5 points.



TROPHIES FOR 5 OR 10 PARTICIPATIONS

Not only tournament winners receive trophies at our tournaments. It is our tradition that players receive a special trophy for their fifth or tenth participation.

2013 ACO WACC: Crete **168 participants / 26 nations**

The 2nd ACO WACC took place on the Greek island of Crete in 2013. Compared to 2012, the number of participants more than doubled. The venue was 4-star Aquis Arina Sand Hotel with a beautiful hall with direct sea view.



2014 ACO WACC: Rhodes **240 participants / 26 nations**

Our 3rd tournament took place on the „sun island“ of Rhodes in 2014. The playing hall stretched of over 1.000 m² where 240 players from 26 countries fought for the titles. Players were accommodated in 4- and 5-star hotels.





ACO WACC 2015-2018 + 2022-2026 on Kos (1500+ players)

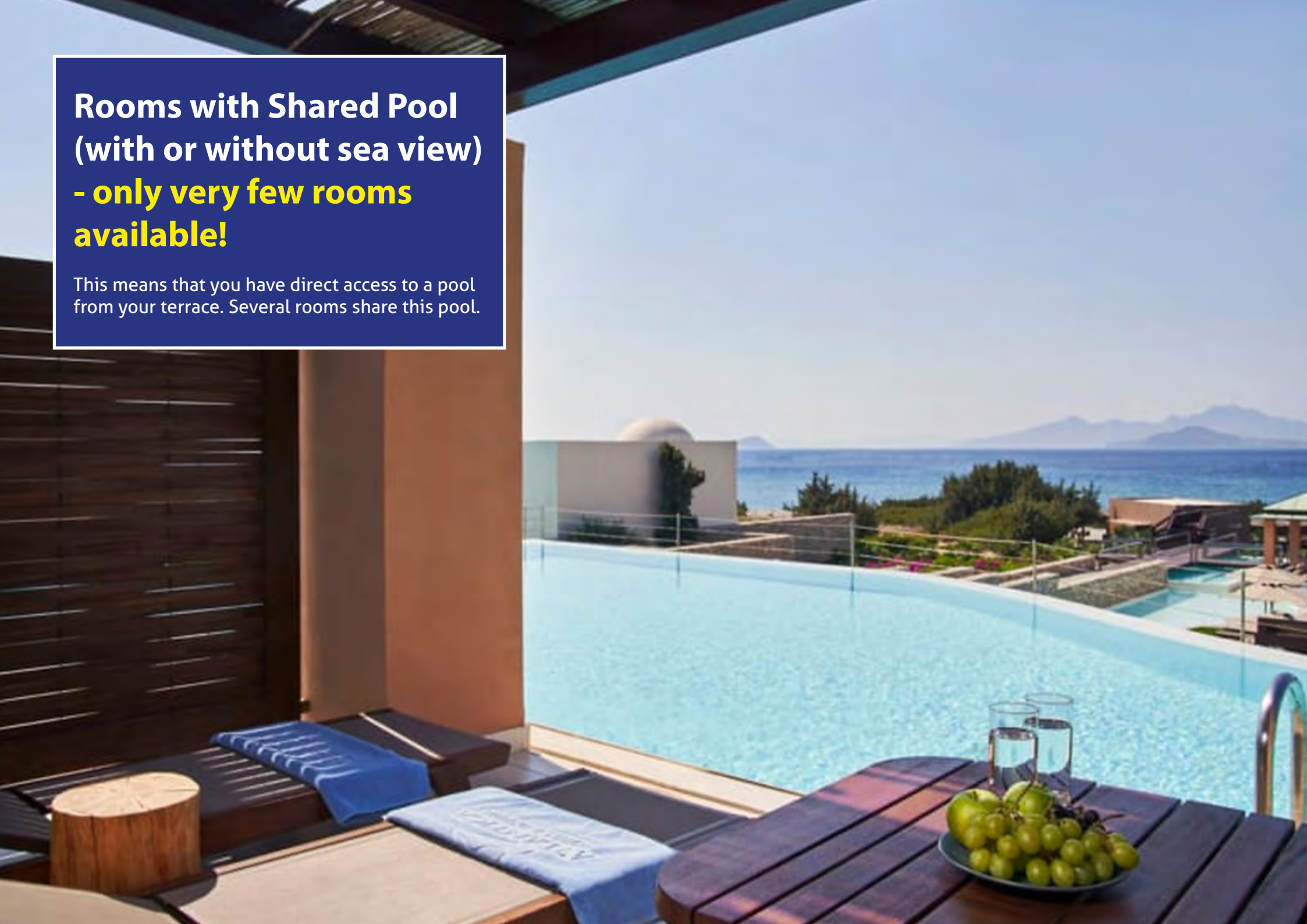

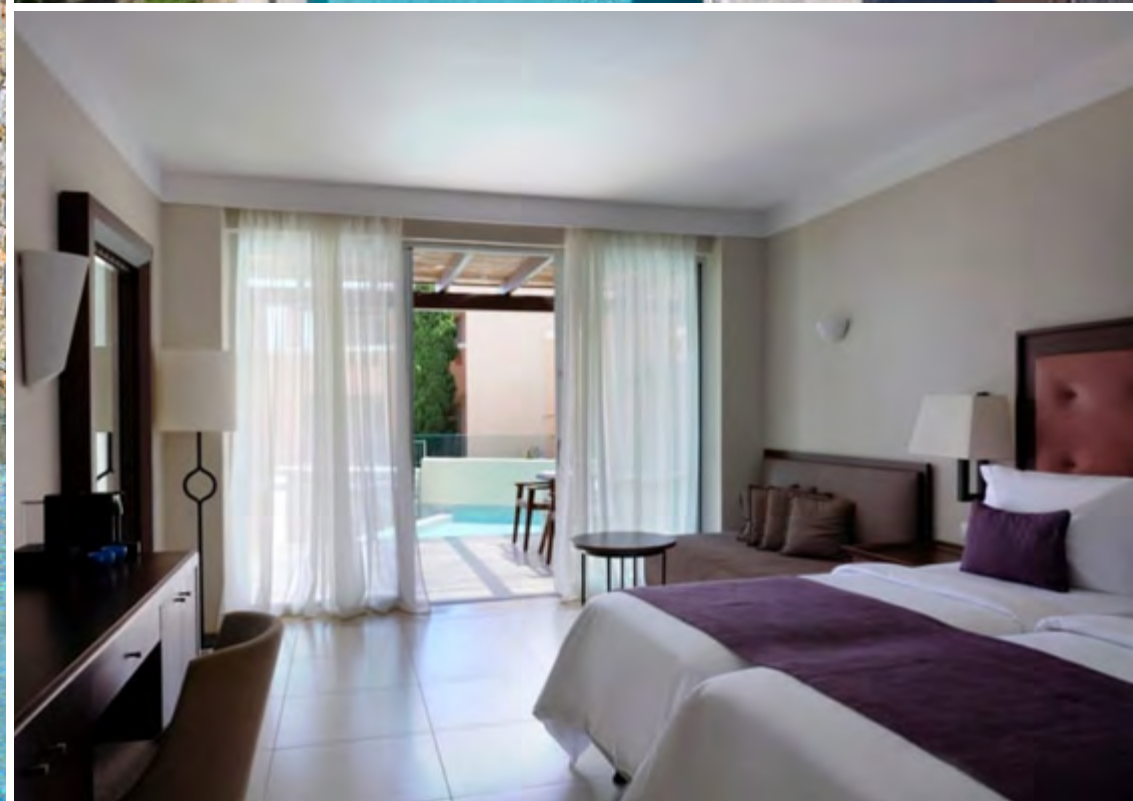

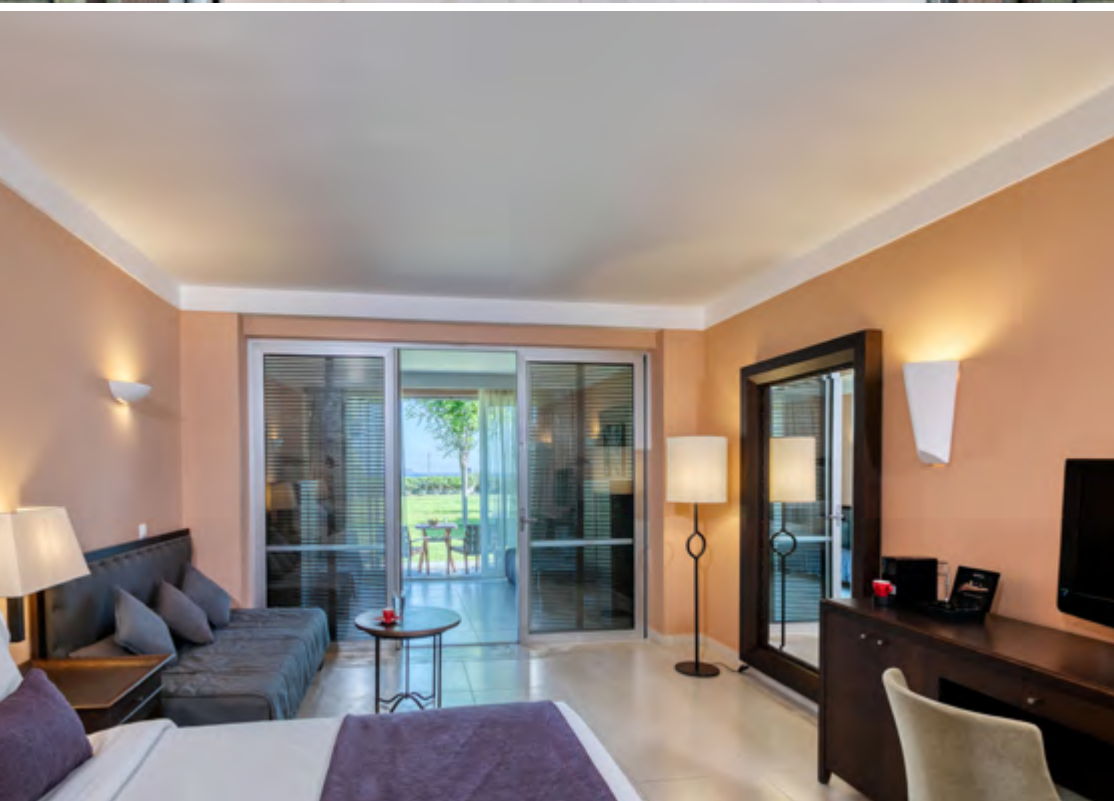
