YEAR 1



COURSE OFFERINGS

Class Title: Arabic 101: The Beginner's Guide to Learning Arabic

INSTRUCTOR:

CREDITS:

3 Credits

Course Description:

This course provides students with a needed base understanding of how Arabic root letters are conjugated to create different words that give information about the subject and action of a sentence. By the end of the course, students will know how to conjugate verbs in various tenses, determine base letters from non-base letters, and identify verbal patterns that convey information about the number, gender, and voice of the subject of a sentence. Through rigorous repetition of the various patterns, as applied to different verbs, newly learned concepts are applied to ensure complete comprehension of the material covered.

First, we will start with the 4 properties of a word, then look at fragments, and finally study the different types of sentences found in the Arabic language.

Second will study the different sarf families, learn the implications of each family, and understand word meanings based on their unique patterns.

Third, we will begin Irab studies with grammatical analysis of simple sentences and then move to the Quran and focus on complex structures and ayahs.

Class Title: Fiqh of Tahara and Salah

Course Description:

This course introduces students to the rulings regarding ritual purification and prayer. The course introduces relevant Islamic legal concepts and covers topics that include the process of wudu and tayammum, the ruling on congregational prayer, the method of prayer when traveling, and more. The course is primarily focused on the rulings and understandings of the Hanafi school of thought but gives reference to differences of opinion amongst the schools.

Class Title: Quran Exegesis: Tafsir of Juz 30**INSTRUCTOR:**

Course Description:

This course allows students to try their hand at applying the grammatical concepts learned in other courses to analyze and interpret Islamic primary sources. The course methodically guides students through the last Juz' of the Qur'an and gives students experience translating the uniquely dynamic and engaging style of the Qur'an's Arabic into English. Along with simple translation, students will learn to recognize and appreciate the thematic coherence between verses and chapters, the deeper meanings of Arabic words, grammatical nuances, the historical context of the revelation of various ayahs, and Qur'anic commentary based on Hadith and the authoritative interpretations of the recognized exegetes of the first generations of Islam. Students are also encouraged to develop and discuss personal reflections on the Quranic text and lessons for their contemporary times.

Class Title: Arabic 201: The Intermediate Guide to Learning Arabic

3 Credits

Course Description:

This course provides an in-depth look into the foundation of understanding written classical Arabic, and Arabic syntax. The course introduces students to the concept of the linguistic case and surveys the various shades of meaning lent to nouns by the different cases. The course also introduces to the many ways active participles and verbs affect the meanings of nouns to give them different shades of meaning. Understanding the concepts in this course is a must for understanding any classical Arabic text.

As with Arabic 101, preparation for class and homework are essential so that students may devote in-class time to communicating in the language rather than talking “about” the language. Upon completion, students will be able to formulate sentences that involve verbs and subjects of different numbers, gender, and voice, will have a working knowledge of some of Arabic’s most common and basic noun forms, and speak Arabic on a beginner’s level.

Class Title: Prophetic Stories (Qasas Al-Nabiyeen)

Course Description:

This course will cover the various stories of the Holy Quran, as well as common Arabic vocabulary. The systemic narratives of the Stories of the Prophets have been written in chronological order which renders a historical style to the course.

This course introduces the student to the mustalah al-hadith. Classification of a hadith is based upon the chain of narration, context, strength of the narrators, number of narrators, etc. This course covers the very basic definitions pertaining to the classification of the hadith. The student will be able to comprehend the basic and common terminology used to classify hadith upon completing this course.

Class Title: Islamic Science of Quran (Uloom ul-Quran)

Course Description:

The knowledge of Uloom al-Quran, or 'The Sciences of the Qur'an' deals with the sciences that have a direct bearing on the recitation, history, understanding, and implementation of the Qur'an. Students will learn about the causes of revelation, the difference between Makki and Madani revelations, the various forms (ahruf) the Quran was revealed in, the understanding of its abrogated rulings and verses (nasikh wal-mansukh), the various classifications of its verses, and the knowledge of its interpretation (tafsir).

Class Title: Principles of Fiqh

Course Description:

Principles of Islamic jurisprudence, also known as uṣūl al-fiqh are traditional methodological principles used in Islamic jurisprudence (fiqh) for deriving the rulings of Islamic law. The traditional theory of Islamic jurisprudence elaborates how the scriptures (Quran and hadith) should be interpreted from the standpoint of linguistics and rhetoric. The course reviews the methods for establishing the authenticity of hadith and for determining when the legal force of a scriptural passage is abrogated by a passage revealed at a later date. An exposition of the methods by which the rules of Fiqh are deduced, covering the sources for Islamic law, rules of interpretation, commands, and prohibitions, the consensus of opinion, and abrogation.

Course Description:

This is the final and most advanced course book in Arabic Morphology in the curriculum. After revising all rules in detail, which govern the law of Arabic Morphology, students learn the various scales of the Arabic verbs (baab). The method through which words are derived from their original pattern is discussed in detail and extensively. Memorization through the implementation of exercises allows students to recognize verbal constructions. Upon completion, students are able to differentiate and identify the scale of every verb in the Arabic language.

Class Title: Quran Exegesis (Surah Israa)

Along with the translation, the course also incorporates interpretations of selected verses which enable the students to fully understand the meaning of the Qur'an.

Class Title: Principles of Marriage and Finance

Conclusions are consistent with the Quran and Sunnah and not biased toward any school or culture.

All classes will be recorded and available after class in a video library on the student portal. Students will have lifetime access to the recordings.

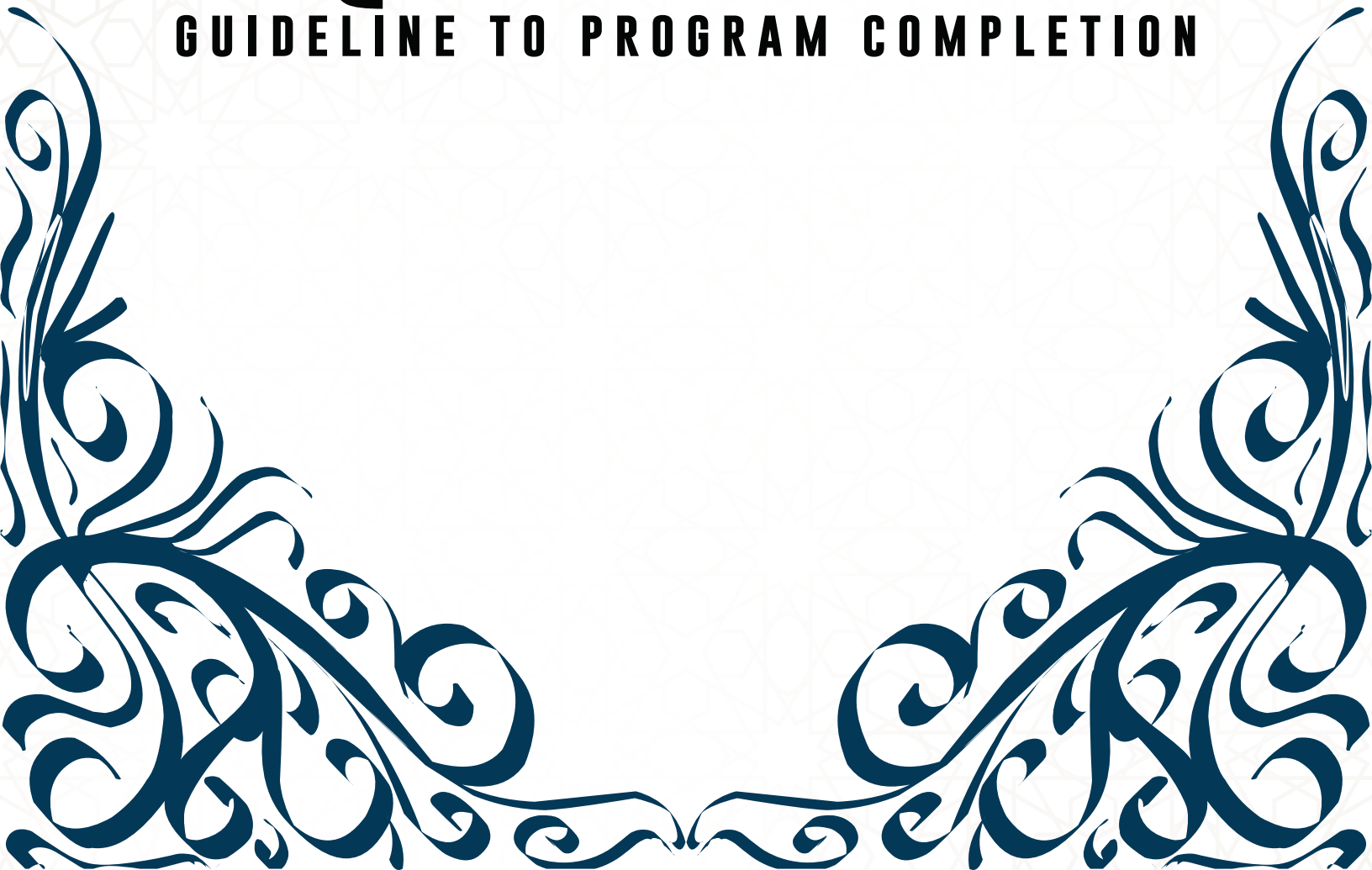
TESTING AND EXAMS

Students will be required to take online midterms and final exams for each course subject. Passing grades will be required in order to obtain course credit. Course grades will be recorded on each student transcript.



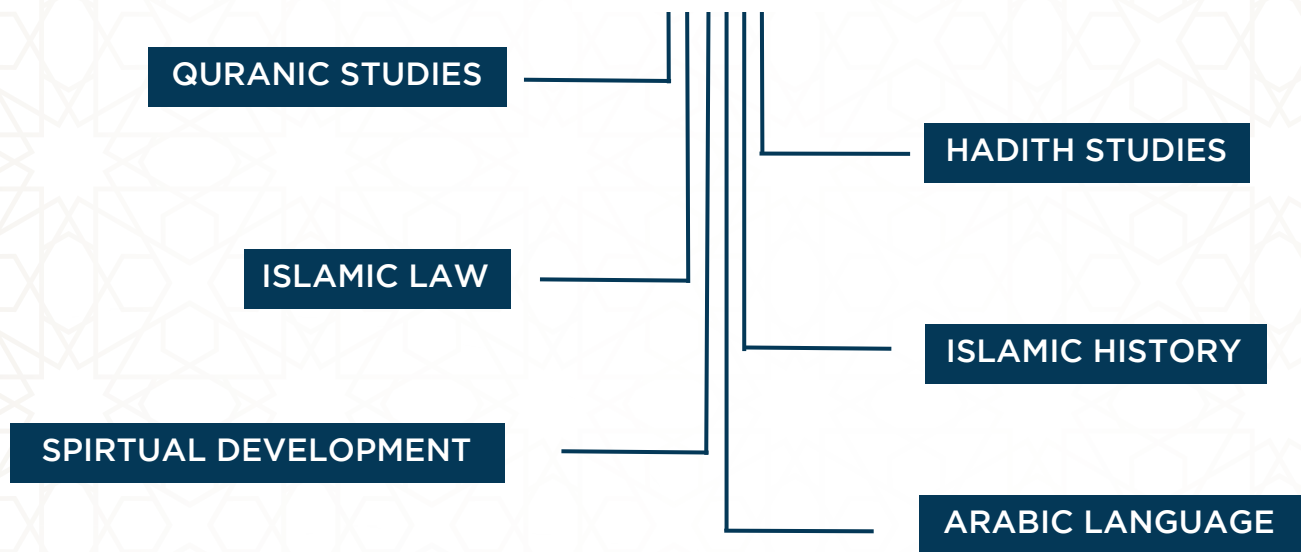

To complete the Miftaah Associate program, the student must complete at least 6 courses per year for a total of 54 credits over three years.

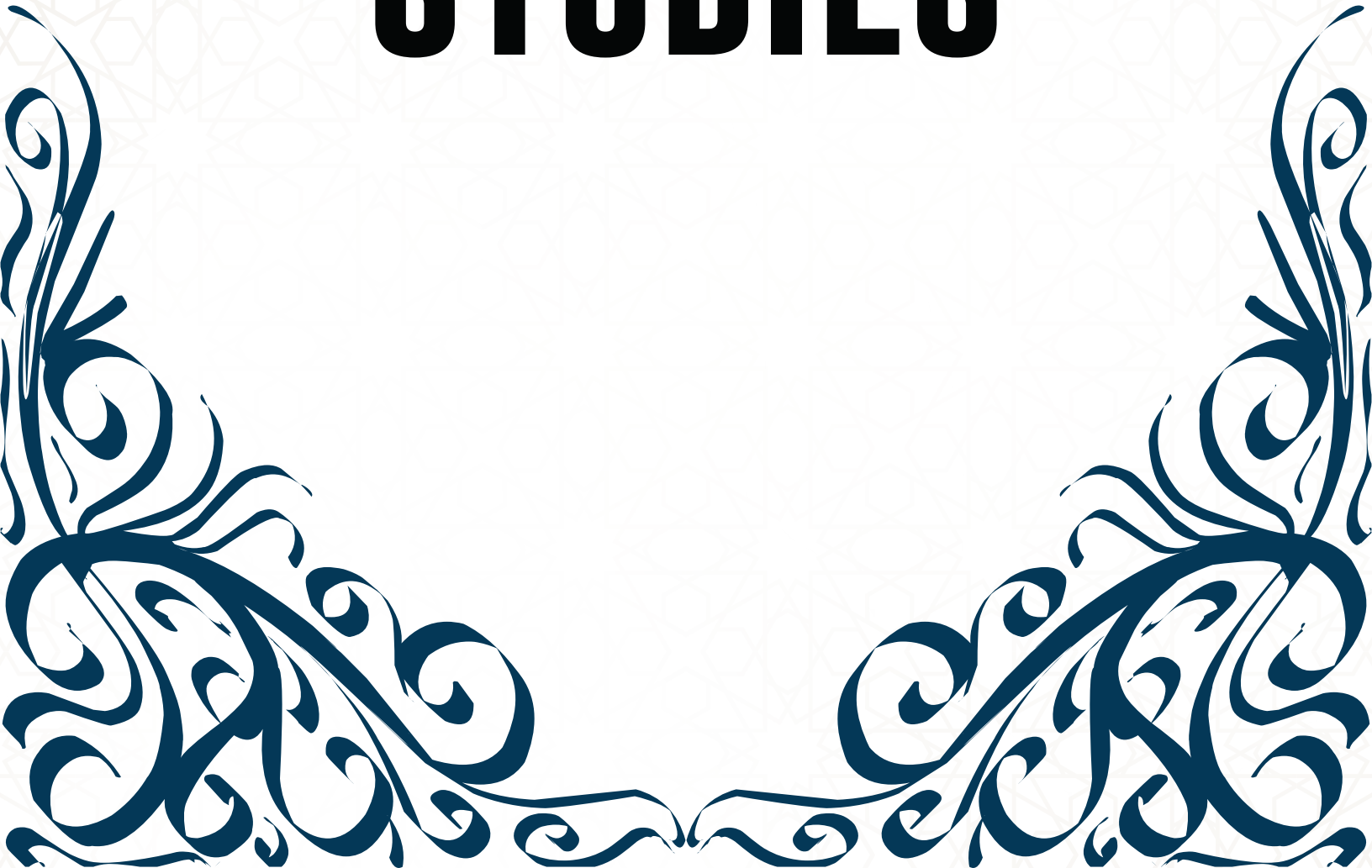

Class Title: Quran Exegesis: Tafsir of Juz 30

Course Description:

The 30th Juz of the Quran, or Juz Amma, consists of 37 of the shorter Surahs that were mostly revealed in the Makkan era. Most of these Surahs are memorized by Muslims and read often in the daily prayers. This class will aim to comprehensively study the themes of these Surahs, including Allah's creation, the reality of this life, the Day of Judgement, the afterlife, Jannah, and Jahnnam.

The course methodically guides students through the last Juz' of the Qur'an and gives students experience translating the uniquely dynamic and engaging style of the Qur'an's Arabic into English. Along with simple translation, students will learn to recognize and appreciate the thematic coherence between verses and chapters, the deeper meanings of Arabic words, grammatical nuances, the historical context of the revelation of various ayahs, and Qur'anic commentary based on Hadith and the authoritative interpretations of the recognized exegetes of the first generations of Islam. Students are also encouraged to develop and discuss personal reflections on the Quranic text and lessons for their contemporary times.

Class Title: Islamic Science of Quran (Uloom ul-Quran)

Course Description:

The subject of 'Uloom al-Qur'an is a study of the various sciences of the Qur'an. These sciences include its history, process of revelation, types of recitation, exegesis and more. This course is designed for students to develop a better understanding and relationship with the Book of Allah. 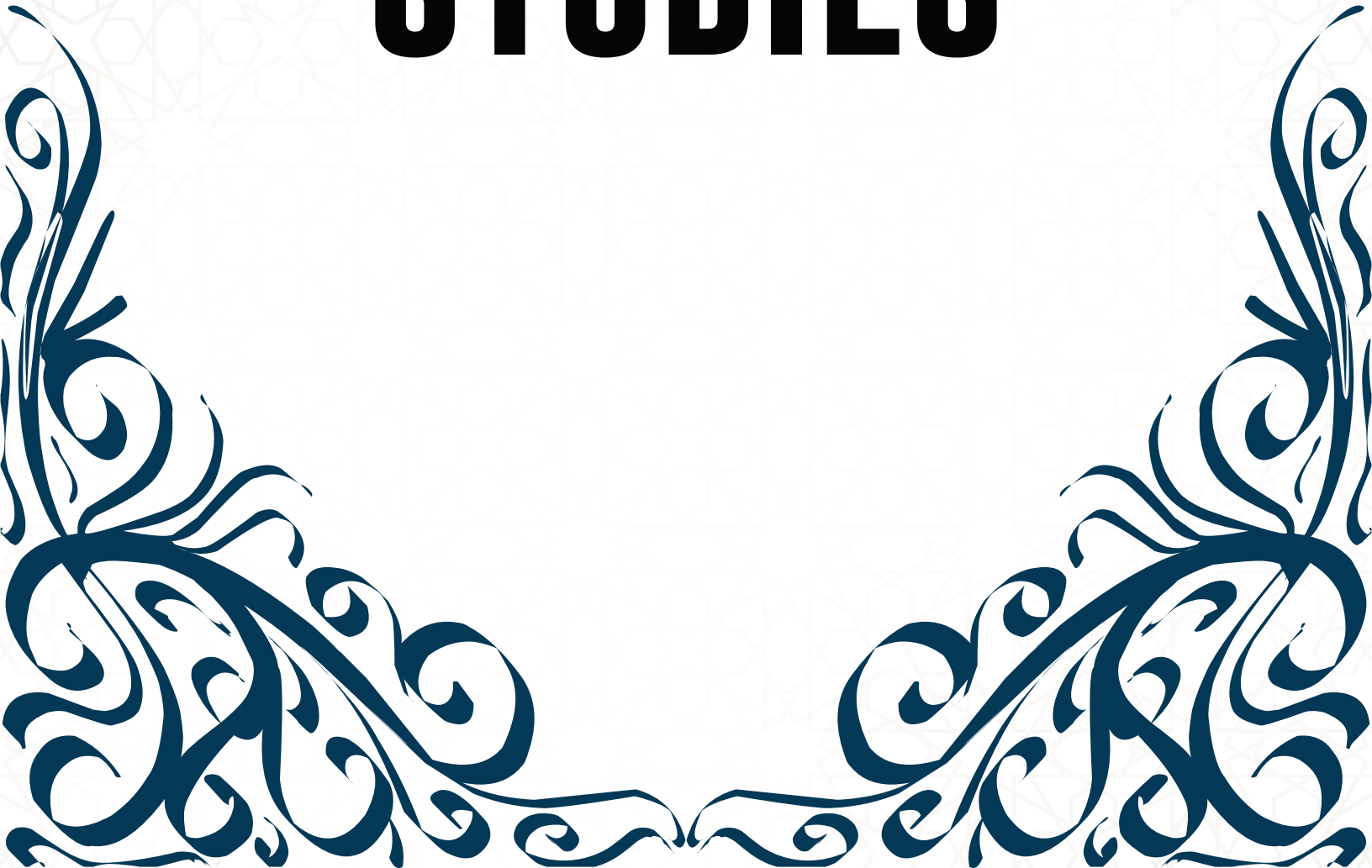

The student will be able to comprehend the basic and common terminology used to classify hadith upon completing this course.

The ritual that we perform five times a day needs to be well prepared for. Salah is our primary connection with Allah SWT and we don't want to be performing it in the wrong way. This class will offer a complete breakdown of Salah, including prerequisites and an end-to-end walkthrough. Issues such as Adhan, Congregational Salah, and Jum'ah will also be discussed. This class will leave you with a clear roadmap of Salah.

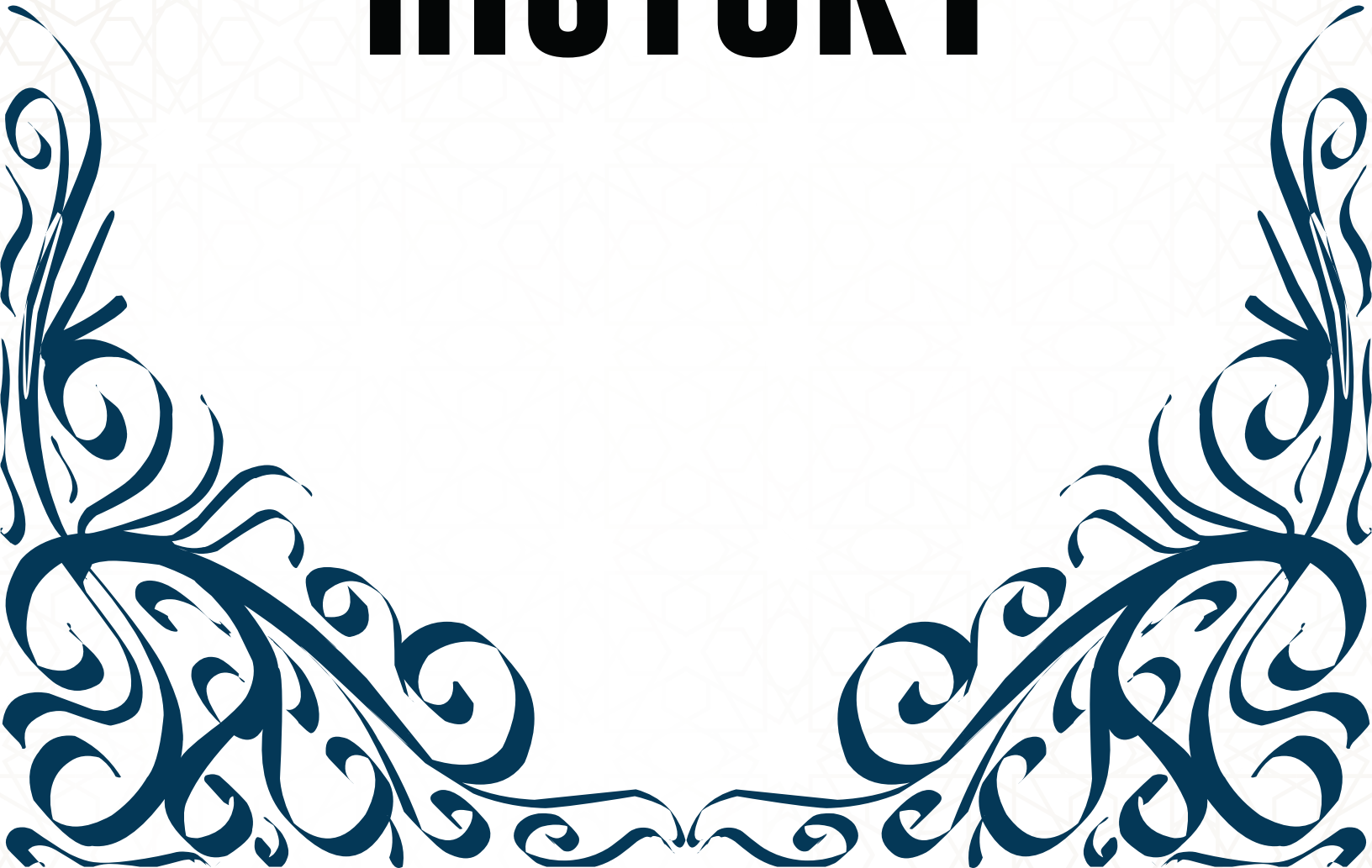

Having been sent to the people of Quraysh in Makkah, one of the most corrupt societies of the time, delivering the message of Islam was no easy task. The Makkan Era is a must-study for Muslims living in the West in order to find guidance on how the Prophet ﷺ stayed true to his principles while being in a society that persecuted him for no reason other than being Muslim.

After having struggled for 13 years, the Prophet ﷺ begins to see his efforts come to fruition. The blessed city of Madinah is illuminated with his arrival and the establishment of the Muslim community begins. Covering the most basic tenets with selected commentary, the course will address contemporary issues in detail. Essentially, the course will cover material that all Muslims need to know, believe and inwardly understand with respect to Islamic creed.

ARABIC LANGUAGE

Class Title: Arabic 101: The Beginner's Guide to Learning Arabic

Course Description:

Nahw: This course consists of a systematic study of Arabic syntax and grammar. The comprehensive text used in this course covers the various classifications of different types of sentences and the different components of a sentence's anatomy, provides a basic but detailed understanding of the Arabic case system, and discusses how Arabic nouns respond to prepositions and verbs in accordance with the role the noun plays in the sentence.

Sarf: The class introduces students to Arabic morphology, focusing initially on conjugation, but then shifting focus to some of the noun forms that words morph into. This course provides students with a necessary base understanding of how Arabic root letters are conjugated to create different words. By the end of the course, students will know how to conjugate verbs in various tenses, determine base letters from non-base letters, and identify verbal patterns that convey information about the number, gender, and voice of the subject of a sentence. Students will also be able to identify the usage of verbs in the Qur'an.

Class Title: Arabic 201: The Intermediate Guide to Learning Arabic

Course Description:

This course is designed for those students that have completed the Arabic 101 course at Miftaah. We will build off of the foundation that we established in Arabic 101. In this semester we will focus on various types of sentence structures, developing reading comprehension, and understanding irregular verbs.

Class Title: Arabic 301: The Advanced Guide to Learning Arabic

Course Description:

This is the final and most advance course book in Arabic Morphology in the curriculum. After revising all rules in detail, which govern the law of Arabic Morphology, students learn the various scales of the Arabic verbs (baab). The method through which words are derived from their original patter (taleelaat) is discussed in detail and extensively. Memorization through implementation of exercises allows students to recognize the verbal constructions. Upon completion, students are able to differentiate and identify the scale of every verb in the Arabic language.

TUITION AND FINANCIAL AID

Tuition is due and payable in advance, via online at miftaah.org/associate. Tuition payments cost \$250 per semester, plus \$100 book fees. The optional Summer semester costs \$100.00.
