Session III: The Passion of Jesus Christ Through the Eyes of Mark

Summary: In this session particular attention is paid to the "dark" dimensions of Mark's Passion, reflected both in the physical darkness at the time of the crucifixion & in the abandonment of Jesus by his own disciples. We consider how OT texts have helped shape the language of the story Mark tells, in order to find meaning in the expected idea of a suffering Messiah. Finally, the question of God's silence & God's absence is explored in the climactic scene of Jesus' death. The focus is on Mark 14:53-15:47.
