## Summary Session 3: Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread

## Luke 11:3 - Give us each day our daily bread

- Active voice: Keep on giving us the bread that we need each day
- Context: Jesus teaching the disciples on the road to Jerusalem
  - o Itinerant life (Lk 9:58; Mt 8:20)
  - o Local friends supporting the mission e.g. Lazarus, Martha & Mary (Lk 10:38-42)
  - o Jesus' followers distinct from Zealots (Lk 10:3-7)
  - o Jesus sends out disciples without provisions or resources (Lk 9:3; Mk 6:8)
    - Need people who will welcome them each day & provide for them
    - Disciples have left everything including family/father
      - > God as abba, their loving & caring father
      - > Radical unconditional trust
- Daily bread bread for the evening or the day to come
  - o Rely on God to provide their basic need (Lk 11:5-8; 9-13; 12:29-30)
  - A new form of society
    - Agape each asks what the other needs & helps accordingly
    - Our community, parish today?

## Matthew 6:11 - Give us today our daily bread

- Disciples to pray for each other's needs as well as their own: "us", "our"
- Mysterious & puzzling cf. Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) #2837.
  - o Greek: "Ton arton epiousion".
    - Lk's version (11:3) prays, "Give us each day our ebiousion bread"
    - Mt (6:11) prays, "Keep giving us this day our epiousion bread."
      - > Epiousion word only occurs here & not in any Greek literature
        - 'Give us today our 'daily' bread'?
        - Give us the bread that we need?
        - Syriac: 'the thing that helps us to flourish'.
- Divergence between Mt & Lk reflecting different aspects of Jesus' teaching
  - o Mt: Give us the blessings of the coming kingdom right now.
    - Give us today our daily bread
  - Lk: Give us every day our daily bread
- Daily bread recalls daily manna in the wilderness (Ex 16:16-22)
  - o People had left behind the security of Egypt
  - To begin a life of mutual solidarity
  - o God fed the people with manna they were not to store it up!
    - The "measure of the day on its day"
    - Jesus' disciples were like Israel in the wilderness
    - The age to come would include bread & no famine.

## **Eucharistic Overtones**

- Ton arton epiousion = panem supersubstantialem (St. Jerome) = supersubstantial bread
  - Not ordinary bread
  - o Jewish salvation history
  - o Rich theological & spiritual symbolism for us today
    - We are God's new people on pilgrimage through history
    - We ask our heavenly Father to keep sustaining us every day
    - Praying Our Father we recognise our communion with one another as God's people
    - We work together to bring about God's kingdom of justice

- We focus on the present day & don't worry about tomorrow (Mt 6:34)
- Trusting confidence appropriate to children (Mt 6:25-34)
- We are a pilgrim Church (St Augustine; Vatican II LG 8)
  - > Like ancient Israel in the desert, we need our daily bread.
  - > Give us each day your presence in the Eucharist.
